 Insurance Presentation On Tuesday, March 23 at 11:30 a.m., Jan Mason, Rebecca Shaffer, and John Puetz of Willis Towers Watson Insurance will make the annual presentation regarding the KSHSAA Liability/Catastrophe Insurance program. A decision to purchase coverage required of all member schools for 2021-22 shall be discussed and determined. Note: This year's premium was \$6.97 per participant and the current proposal will increase \$0.09 to \$7.06. The catastrophic fee remains the same, but the increase is based upon increase to liability component. (Action)

It is recommended that the proposal for one-year liability/catastrophic coverage be approved at \$7.06 per student participating in athletic activities.

10. **Postseason Officiating Pay Rates** – At your last meeting we began the annual review of the pay rates for postseason officiating. This year, basketball, cross country, football, and gymnastics officials pay rates are scheduled for review. –*See Support Material*– (Action)

It is recommended that fees increase for basketball and cross country officials as outlined in support material, but remain unchanged for football officials and gymnastics officials. —See Support Material— (Information/Discussion)

- 13. **2021-22 Membership Dues** The current membership dues are \$500 High School and \$200 Jr. High/Middle School. Dues were increased in 2020 (prior to that, the most recent increase was in 1988). Per Bylaw Article IX, dues are approved by the Board of Directors. (Action)

It is recommended that membership dues remain at \$500/HS and \$200/MS/JH for the 2021-22 school year.

14. **2021-22 Approved School Application and Fee, and process review** – Schools seeking Approved School status make annual application for such designation. As part of the application, schools currently pay a fee of \$200 and an optional (additional) \$50 for debate participation. Fees were last increased for 2017-18 school year. – *See Support Material* – **(Action)**

It is recommended that the Approved School fee remain at \$200 with optional (additional) fee of \$50 for those participating in debate.

- 15. **Public Private School** Work Group The initial planning meeting for the Public/Private Classification Work Group was conducted virtually on February 22. Seventeen of the 19 members attended. 21. **Amendment to Handbook Rule re Show Choir** - Staff recommends the Executive Board add the following KMEA recommendation to the agenda for the April 30 Board of Directors meeting: - *See Support Material* -

Rule 46, Section 1

- **Art. 2:** Kansas music activities hosted by member schools or approved by the Executive Board may be rated and receive oral and/or written critiques, but shall not be ranked or receive cash or merchandise awards.
 - a. Kansas marching band and show choir activities hosted by member schools or approved by the Executive Board may be ranked, rated and receive oral and/or written critiques as long as the event falls within the guidelines of the KSHSAA mileage limitations. Out-of-state music activities approved by the Executive Board and the out-of-state high school association may be ranked, rated and receive oral and/or written critiques as long as the activity falls within the guidelines of the KSHSAA mileage limitations. (See Bylaws, Article XIV Approval of Events.)
- 22. **Non-Licensed Coach Aides** Per request of an Executive Board member, time is allocated to discuss **Rule 10-Qualifications of Coaches**, Coaches Aide requirements which are outlined in support material. –*See Support Material* (**Discussion**)
- 23. **Marketing Project** The KSHSAA has been approached by two or more potential partners expressing in interest in a marketing partnership. In such a relationship, the partner would market Association available inventory on behalf of the KSHSAA. In order to determine inventory, intern Michael Brooks has reviewed activities and will provide a report. Discussion will focus on the interest of the Executive Board to pursue potential partnership. - 24. **NFHS Summer Meeting** Currently, the NFHS is planning to conduct a traditional summer meeting with in-person attendance. The meeting will be in Orlando, FL and is scheduled for June 28-July 2. The summer meeting provides critical professional development while serving as an important team-building and significant networking opportunity for attendees. The fall activity administrators will also attend activity specific Rules Interpreter meetings.
