2017-18 AUDIT REPORT APPROVED

Mr. Faffick presented the Executive Board with the annual certified audit report prepared by Wendling, Noe, Nelson, & Johnson L.L.C. of Topeka. Following Mr. Faffick's review of the audit, the Board voted unanimously to approve the audit report. The report will be printed in the October 2018 issue of the *KSHSAA Activities Journal*.

MIDDLE/JR. HIGH SCHOOL SPIRIT STUNTING FOR 6TH GRADE STUDENTS

Following discussion, the Executive Board supports the interpretation that 6th grade students participating in Jr. high/middle school spirit activities shall not participate in partner stunts in any capacity.

VOLLEYBALL SEEDING

Following discussion, the Executive Board supports moving the Class 6A, 5A, 4A sub-state volleyball seeding time to 10:00 a.m. on Friday, October 12, 2018. Following a review of challenges during this transition year, seeding dates/times for future years will be determined.

VOLLEYBALL LINE JUDGES TO USE FLAGS

Following discussion, the Executive Board voted to require the use of flags for all line judges in volleyball matches beginning with the 2019 season.

EVENTS FOR INCLUSION AT STATE TRACK

Following a presentation by J. Means regarding inclusion of para-athletes in the state track meet, the Executive Board requested further discussion at Regional Administrator meetings and future Executive Board meetings.

NCAA BASKETBALL RECRUITING

Following discussion, the Executive Board supports working with KCA, KABC and NFHS to determine how the developing NCAA Men's Basketball recruiting rules will be implemented in Kansas.

TOPEKA-WASHBURN RURAL PERFORMING ARTS HONORED

The Executive Board recognized Topeka-Washburn Rural High School, staff and students involved in their performing arts programs as they have been selected as the NFHS National Performing Arts School of Excellence.

MEMBER MIDDLE/JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS REQUEST LEAGUE AFFILIATION HEARING

Superintendents, Principals and Athletic Directors for Hutchinson, McPherson, Salina-Lakewood and Salina-South Middle Schools, appeared before the Executive Board to request the Association assign each of their schools to a league per **Bylaw ARTICLE XV, League Affiliation**, which reads as follows:

Section 1: Any member school not a member of a league or similar organization may apply to the KSHSAA Executive Board for assistance in acquiring league affiliation.

Section 2: The Board of Directors of the KSHSAA shall develop procedures whereby: (1) the requesting school shall submit sufficient evidence to the Executive Board that it has made a conscientious effort to become affiliated with an existing league; (2) if it appears that the Executive Board may take affirmative action on the request, the requesting school and any league to which the school may be assigned shall have an opportunity to be heard by

the Executive Board prior to the time the assignment is made; (3) the Executive Board, after considering all the facts in the matter, may assign the school to an existing league; (4) in the event a school is assigned to a league under the above-mentioned circumstances, no members shall withdraw from that league for a period of three years without unanimous consent of all members of the league including the newly-assigned school, or approval of the Executive Board.

Newton-Chisholm Middle School was not present for the discussion, but is included in the request for a hearing. All five schools are members of the Pioneer Middle School League, which lost 21 other member schools at the end of the 2017-18 school year. Information was presented to the Executive Board detailing unsuccessful efforts by the schools to pursue league membership.

It was the decision of the Executive Board to grant a league assignment hearing at the next meeting of the Executive Board. Subsequently, that hearing has been scheduled for **Wednesday, November 14, 2018 at 2:30 p.m.** The Executive Board voted to have the members of the **Centennial Middle League, the Central Kansas Jr. League, the Patriot League, and the Wichita Suburban League** appear for purposes of this hearing. It was noted, these leagues have similar sized middle schools in their membership and their member schools are in the approximate geographic area of some or all of the schools. Superintendents and principals of all schools in the four identified leagues will receive a communication from Mr. Faflick inviting them to attend and participate in the November hearing.

2018-19 BUDGET APPROVED

Following a hearing held on **Wednesday, September 12, 2018 at 11:30 a.m.** in the office of the KSHSAA, the Executive Board unanimously approved the KSHSAA budget for the 2018-19 school year and authorized its publication and distribution to the member schools.

Details concerning each of the charts of accounts listed are available upon request. A summary of the approved budget will be included in the October Journal.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING FORMAT

The Board of Directors assembled at 4:00 p.m. Wednesday evening for an orientation session, discussion and voting on the Agenda items.

President Britton Hart advised members an item could be added to the agenda provided three-fourths of those present (61) agreed. (45 votes would be required.) No additions were requested.

Following public hearings, discussion and voting of all agenda items, the Board recessed at 6:20 p.m.

PUBLIC FORUM

No speakers were present to address the Board.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Bill Faflick, Executive Director, called roll, presented remarks on the Association's financial position, and updated the members of the Board of Directors on business and policy matters of the Association.

APRIL 2018 MINUTES APPROVED

Following the Call to Order by President Britton Hart and the roll call, B. Lewis moved, second by G. Rosenhagen, to approve the Minutes of the April 27, 2018, Board of Directors' meeting. The motion passed (61-0).

All agenda items passed become effective immediately upon publication of these minutes unless otherwise specified.

NOTE: Words or phrases which appear underlined in the following sections indicate the changes which were made.

UPDATE MADE TO BASEBALL RULE

A proposal was made to modify **Rule 32, Baseball (boys), Section 2** as follows:

Rule 32 Baseball

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

~~Art. 5: A school may be allowed to participate in a higher classification group (one with schools of a larger enrollment), with the approval of the Executive Board when just cause is shown.~~

T. Theurer moved adoption of the proposal, second by P. Lane. The vote was 60 in favor, 1 opposed.

FOOTBALL RULE COMPETITION MODIFIED

A proposal was made to modify **Rule 35, Football, Sections 1(Art. 1)-2(Art. 2)-3(Art. 2)** as follows:

Rule 35 Football

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art.1: No middle/junior or senior high school shall be represented in a game or scrimmage with any outside teams or group until it has had (JH/MS – 13, HS – 14) days of practice prior to (and not including) the first schedule day of competition. Competition shall not begin prior to Wednesday of Standardized Calendar Week #9.

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

Art. 2: Each senior high team is limited to a maximum of nine (9) regular-season games during one season. No student shall participate in more than two games per week, or games on consecutive days (~~beginning in 2016~~), and may not participate in more than four quarters in any one day. Teams shall have at least three days between scheduled games.

NOTE: While this rule does not limit a player to an absolute maximum of nine regular-season games, including first team and reserve-team contests, cares should be taken to protect the health and physical well-being of all participants.

Section 3: Middle/Junior High Regulations

Art. 2: Each middle/junior high team is limited to a maximum of seven (7) regular-season games during one season. No student shall participate in more than two games per week, or games on consecutive days (~~beginning in 2016~~), and may not participate in more than four quarters in any one day. Teams shall have at least three days between scheduled games.

NOTE: While this rule does not limit a player to an absolute maximum of seven regular-season games, including first team and reserve-team contests, cares should be taken to protect the health and physical well-being of all participants.

EXCEPTION: Ninth grade students in junior high schools shall be permitted to compete in the same number of athletic competitions as ninth graders in senior high schools.

S. Boden moved adoption of the proposal for the 2019 season, second by M. Crouch. An amendment was made by T. Theurer, second by J. Hines, to adopt the proposal for the 2020 season instead of 2019. The amendment was approved by a vote of 35 in favor, 26 opposed. The proposal was adopted for implementation in the 2020 season, 44 in favor, 17 opposed.

LANGUAGE ADDED TO DEBATE AND SPEECH RULE

A proposal was made to update the language for **Rule 47, Debate and Speech, Section 2, Article 8** as follows:

Rule 47 Debate and Speech

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

Art. 8: No student shall represent his or her school in more than eight speech festivals or tournaments in addition to the regional and state festival or championship. Included in these festivals and tournaments shall be speech activities identified in the *KSHSAA Debate, Speech & Drama*

Manual as being under the jurisdiction of the Association held as festivals, tournaments or meets and sponsored by member schools or outside agencies. (See **Rule 47-2-7.**)

NOTE: Each student is limited to seven competitive speech events, except that should his or her school host a league or invitational tournament, then he or she may participate in eight competitive speech events. If a school attempts to host a tournament and is unable to do so, it may appeal to the Executive Board for a waiver of this regulation to permit its students to enter eight competitive speech events.

Exceptions:

(1) One-Act Play festivals or tournaments do not count toward the eight festival or tournament limit.

(2) Students may compete in Lincoln-Douglas debate on Friday and Individual Events on Saturday at a different site with the weekend counting as only one tournament against an individual's eight tournament limit.

S. Harrell moved adoption of the proposal, second by P. Lane. The vote was 61 in favor, none opposed.

All Appeal Board members signed an Oath of Office.

Travis Githens served as chairperson, Jason Walker served as vice-chairperson, Sonya Martin as recording secretary and Jerry Flanagan as alternate recording secretary. These officer positions will remain in place until such election is necessary.

Purpose of Appeal:

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS AND UPDATES

The Board received reports from Executive Director Bill Faflick, and the Assistant Executive Directors regarding the status of programs and services of the Association. The Executive Director gave a financial report and also an update on the business of the National Federation of State High School Associations following the recent NFHS Winter meeting which Mr. Faflick attended, as well as an update on the business of National Interscholastic Administrators Association following their annual conference and attended by Ms. Martin.

APPEAL BOARD and BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION REMINDER

Member schools are reminded of upcoming elections for positions on the KSHSAA Appeals Board and Board of Directors. A mailing was sent in early January providing information on positions for members of local boards of education and junior high/middle and senior high school administrators. Individuals interested in being candidates for these positions must submit their names to the KSHSAA by February 15. Please see **Bylaws IV and VII** in the Handbook for the required procedures to submit candidate names. The February issue of the Activities Journal contains a special section with this information.

Senior high school principals should note information reminding them to identify their league affiliation and league representatives to the KSHSAA Board of Directors for 2019-2020 was sent to them via email on January 16th.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS APRIL AGENDA DEADLINE REMINDER

Per **Amendments Bylaw, Article XVI** in the KSHSAA Handbook, member schools are reminded **Friday, March 15, 2019** is the deadline to propose KSHSAA Handbook rule changes for consideration by the Board of Directors at their next meeting, April 26-27, 2019.

SPORTS MEDICINE & STUDENT SAFETY

The Executive Board heard a report and discussed concussions and collection of concussion data. Additionally, it was reported a work group of the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee is developing a best practice protocol for schools hosting cross country meets.

KSHSAA "SPIRIT OF SPORT" & "HEART OF THE ARTS" AWARDS

Assistant Executive Director Rod Garman reported on nominations received for this year's awards program. The selection process in determining a state honoree for the KSHSAA award in each category continues to involve the KSHSAA Student Advisory Team. The SAT is in the process of evaluating all nominations received and will select the Kansas recipient in each category. Both Kansas honorees will then be forwarded to the National Federation of State High School Associations as the candidate representing Kansas for consideration for national level awards.

NFHS NETWORK

The KSHSAA will partner with the NFHS Network for a pilot broadcast of the boys state swimming and diving championship this February. This pilot will include the ability to utilize a digital ticketing process via Huddle Tickets.

GIRLS WRESTLING ADDED TO BOARD OF DIRECTORS AGENDA

The Executive Board placed modifications to Handbook **Rule 44 Wrestling (Boys)** and Handbook **Rule 23 Mixed Teams** on the agenda for the April Board of Directors. Such modifications provide opportunity for a state wrestling championship tournament for girls to be conducted annually. Proposed temporary modifications to **Rule 23 Mixed Teams** would allow a transition period for member schools to develop appropriate competition schedules for girls only competition.

GOLF TOURNAMENT FORMAT

The Executive Board placed modifications to Handbook **Rule 36 Golf (Girls & Boys)** on the agenda for the April Board of Directors. Such modifications provide opportunity for a 36-hole state championship tournament for golf.

MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION

The Executive Board received the request from Wichita Central Christian Academy for membership consideration. Head of School Michael Hunter and Secondary School Principal/Athletic Director Kenny Waddell provided background information as well as projected growth for their school. The Board will make a final decision on membership at an upcoming meeting.

CPR/AED TRAINING FOR COACHES/SPONSORS

The Executive Board placed modifications to Handbook **Rule 10 Qualifications of Coaches (Athletic, Spirit, Scholars Bowl and Speech)** on the April Board of Directors agenda. The proposal includes a requirement for all coaches/sponsors to be certified or trained in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED) administration. Additional sport manual information was presented and discussed.

HALL OF FAME

The Executive Board received the minutes and a report following the selection meeting for the 2019 KSHSAA Hall of Fame Committee. Five individuals were selected from 26 qualified nominees. Those selected are official Oscar Birt (Girard), student Marcel Carter (Gainesville, FL), coach Fred Cottrel (Conway Springs), student Perry Ellis (Wichita), and student Erik Nielsen (Hamburg, Germany). More information on these individuals is available on the Gallery of Champions at www.kshsaachamps.org.

PUBLIC/PRIVATE SCHOOLS

The Executive Board received a report from Superintendent Dr. Brian Biermann (Louisburg) and Principal Jeff Hines (Paola) regarding public-private schools. This report included the results of a recent survey conducted by representatives of two member

schools with responses from member school superintendents, principals, and athletic directors. Also included in the report were results of a similar survey conducted in December of 2016 and the KSHSAA Public-Private Study Committee report. The Executive Board requested staff to develop and share (at the upcoming March meeting) a proposed plan and timeline necessary to facilitate engagement of stakeholders needed to address the concerns expressed in this regard.

MANAGED SERVICES

The Executive Board received a report regarding a possible contract for the Association network to be managed by a third party. Staff will continue to review options and will present a more detailed recommendation at an upcoming meeting.

NCAA BASKETBALL RECRUITING

Plans are being developed to allow Kansas high school boys basketball players the opportunity to participate in a recruiting showcase. The new NCAA recruiting guidelines now provide Division I coaches this window for evaluation of prospects. Kansas will partner with Arkansas, Iowa, Missouri, Nebraska, and Oklahoma for an event tentatively scheduled for June 21-23 in Liberty, MO. The KSHSAA will partner with KBCA and KCA to determine the final invite list for this event.

OFFICIALS REGISTRATION FEES

The Executive Board approved a proposal to increase registration fees for officials by \$5 for the next school year. The new registration fee will be \$55.

OFFICIATING FEES

On an annual basis, the Association reviews officiating fees in a planned three year rotation of all sports. KSHSAA staff provided the Executive Board with information on postseason officiating fees in the sports of volleyball, wrestling, baseball, and softball. Staff provided the Board with an analysis of the fiscal impact if fees were to be increased. Following preliminary analysis, the Board referred this item to the agenda of their March meeting for final consideration.

LEAGUE AFFILIATION

The Executive Board received information and discussed a possible league re-alignment for many of the larger schools in the Johnson County area. Additionally, they were made aware of challenges a smaller school is evaluating as they consider membership in a multi-state league.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION/DISCUSSION

The Executive Board received information in discussion format regarding the following items:

1. A correspondence received following the Middle School League Assignment Hearing conducted at the November meeting from Superintendent Gary Price (Hutchinson), and subsequent follow up correspondence and clarification of action/response from the KSHSAA.
2. An eligibility appeal hearing requested by the parents of a transfer student was cancelled by the family. This

also involved a forfeiture required by a member school for playing an ineligible basketball player in a boys contest.

3. Concern expressed by two member schools regarding their inability to have girls wrestle against boys in a double dual hosted by private member school in the Kansas City Diocese per policy of the host school diocese.
4. Follow up to correspondences between the KSHSAA and a member school regarding sportsmanship concerns involving actions of a head coach as part of the state championship football game.

The Executive Board met in the office of the Kansas State High School Activities Association on Tuesday, March 19, 2019, with the following in attendance: President Britton Hart, Mike Crouch, Bob Diepenbrock, Tom Flax, Tracey Gros, Shannon Haydock, Deena Horst, Penny Lane, Mark Meyer, Terry Ostmeier, Rudy Perez, Alan Stein and Bill Faflick, Executive Director. Assistant Executive Directors Cheryl Gleason, Francine Martin, Mark Lentz, Jeremy Holaday, Craig Manteuffel, Rod Garman and Office/Operations Manager Brent Unruh were also present.

The Executive Board welcomed Dr. Deena Horst, attending her first meeting following appointment as the representative of the KSBOE and replacing Kathy Busch.

The Minutes of the January 9-10, 2019 meeting were approved.

Items approved by KSHSAA staff on behalf of the Executive Board were reviewed. **A list of these items may be found at the end of these minutes.**

PUBLIC FORUM

None present.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

The Executive Board received reports from Executive Director Bill Faflick and the Assistant Executive Directors regarding the status of programs and services of the Association. The staff reported on the culmination of winter activities and plans for the upcoming spring activity season. The Executive Director gave a financial report.

LIABILITY AND CATASTROPHIC INSURANCE UPDATE

Spencer Fields and Jan Mason of Willis Towers Watson Insurance, met with the Executive Board to provide an update on information pertaining to liability, catastrophic and medical coverage for member schools of the KSHSAA for the 2019-20 school year. It was voted unanimously to purchase coverage through Mutual of Omaha. Information regarding coverage and the premium per student will be mailed to all member school superintendents and principals in May with the annual membership mailing. There are no changes in coverage from last year (\$25K deductible, \$5M lifetime benefit). More specific information regarding coverage and benefits for the 2019-20 school year will be provided in the membership mailing. The premium per student will increase by 22 cents (3.4%) next school year. Member schools will pay **\$6.83 to cover each student (grades 7 – 12) participating in KSHSAA activities**, regardless of the number of activities in which the student participates.

POSTSEASON OFFICIATING FEES

Based on the established three-year rotation, staff presented Executive Board members with historic background on fees presently paid to officials working postseason contests in baseball, softball, volleyball and wrestling. After reviewing the information provided, the following game fees were approved effective with the 2019-20 school year:

As a follow up to the request and presentation in the January meeting by Head of School Michael Hunter and Secondary School Principal/Athletic Director Kenny Waddell, the KSHSAA voted unanimously to approve Wichita Central Christian Academy for KSHSAA membership effective with the 2019-20 school year.

MEMBER SCHOOL DUES APPROVED FOR 2019-2020

The Executive Board voted unanimously to continue member school dues at the current level of \$400 senior high and \$125 middle school/junior high for the 2019-20 school year. KSHSAA membership materials will be mailed in May to building principals and superintendents of all member schools.

MIDDLE/JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL AT-LARGE REPRESENTATIVE APPOINTED TO BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Per **Bylaw, Article IV, Section 5**, the Executive Board appointed Principal Brandon Simmelink, McPherson Middle School, to a two-year at-large term on the Board of Directors (2019-2021).

SANTA FE TRAIL LEAGUE REPRESENTATIVE

With the Santa Fe Trail League adding a fourth school as an additional member, they are once again eligible for representation on the KSHSAA Board of Directors.

PRIVATE SCHOOL UPDATE

As a next step following discussion and request of the Executive Board at the January 9-10, 2019 meeting, the Executive Board received a report and plan to address concerns expressed by members of the Frontier League. The board received a summary of discussion of member private school leadership teams expressed during a meeting on February 27, 2019. The focus moving forward is to increase transparency and education regarding this issue. This is inclusive of rules review, meeting with leagues, partnership with educational entity for in-depth study, and continued communication/education with stakeholders.

TENNIS REGIONALS

The executive board approved regional tennis tournaments with eight (8) or fewer teams to conduct one day competitions, regardless of the number of teams in the classification.

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT APPROVED

Per **Rule 29-2-1(a)3**, the Executive Board voted unanimously to approve a cooperative agreement between Sedan, Howard-West Elk, and Burden-Central for boys golf for the spring 2019 season.

SUMMER MORATORIUM

The Executive Board approved the following interpretations for the summer moratorium scheduled for July 1-7, 2019; during this time:

COACHES MAY take a vacation.

COACHES MAY coach their child on an individual basis.

SCHOOL COACHES MAY NOT work with middle/high school (7-12) students during this time frame.

COACHES MAY NOT SWAP TEAMS with another school coach (boys/girls, other school team). A coach from another school cannot coach your school team. Coaches from another sport entirely cannot coach another sport's team.

NO SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION is permitted including the school coach providing personal transportation to students from their school team.

SCHOOL FACILITIES MUST be closed to any school coach and students. *EXCEPTION (SEE BELOW)*

STUDENTS MAY BE PERMITTED to participate in events/competitions at a school facility if an outside agency/group/organization leases the facility for competition and organizes the event.

STUDENTS MAY compete during this time but they cannot be coached by a school coach.

NO team camps.

ACTIVITY TESTING AND RULES MEETING ACCOUNTABILITY FOR COACHES

The Executive Board discussed the expectations and accountability for head coaches to attend a rules meeting and to successfully complete a rules test for their respective activity. The discussion included expansion of the KSHSAA portal to include assistant coach rosters and learning expectations. The board tabled any decision until the April meeting.

INDEPENDENT DEBATE PARTICIPATION

The Executive Board received an update on the increasing number of independent debate opportunities following the state championship and the impact on Kansas students and schools.

6-PLAYER FOOTBALL DISCUSSION

The Executive Board received a report and engaged in discussion regarding the history of 6-player football and deliberated regarding the potential growth of the 6-player format.

BOARD OF DIRECTOR MEETING

Following a preview of the proposed KSHSAA Board of Directors agenda, to the large number of items on the April Board of Directors agenda, the start time for the meeting was advanced one hour and will begin at **3:00 p.m.** on April 26, 2019 at the KSHSAA office.

The Executive Board met in the offices of the Kansas State High School Activities Association on Thursday and Friday, April 25-26, 2019, with the following in attendance: President Britton Hart, Bob Diepenbrock, Tom Flax, Tracey Gros, Deena Horst, Penny Lane, Mark Meyer, Terry Ostmeyer, Rudy Perez, Alan Stein and Bill Faflick, Executive Director. Assistant Executive Directors Cheryl Gleason, Francine Martin, Mark Lentz, Jeremy Holaday, Craig Manteuffel, Rod Garman and Office/Operations Manager Brent Unruh were also present. Executive Board members Mike Crouch and Shannon Haydock were absent.

The Minutes of the March 19, 2019, meeting were approved.

Items approved by KSHSAA staff on behalf of the Executive Board were reviewed. ***A list of these items may be found at the end of these minutes.***

PUBLIC FORUM

None present.

CONTRACTS AND SALARIES AUTHORIZED

The Executive Board approved contracts for the Assistant Executive Directors; the Executive Board also approved a staff salary budget of \$1,579,410 for the 2019-20 fiscal year.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS AND UPDATES

The Executive Board heard reports from Executive Director Bill Faflick and administrative staff regarding the status of programs and services of the Association. Staff reported on spring activity seasons currently underway. The Executive Director gave a financial report and update on legislative and legal issues.

MUSIC FESTIVAL FEES

Following a review and discussion of fees for music adjudicators, the Executive Board approved a \$225 stipend and \$25 daily per diem for regional and state music adjudicators. Additionally, the Board approved 40% of entry fees to be provided to the host site. Finally, the Board approved an increase of \$5 for all large group entries and small ensembles, as well as a \$2 increase for all piano, vocal, and instrumental solo entries in the state music festivals.

SPORTS MEDICINE ADVISORY COMMITTEE

KSHSAA staff member Brent Unruh, ATC, reported on the April 8th meeting of the KSHSAA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee providing data regarding the initial year (to date) data on concussions reported. Additionally, the board received information regarding wrestling weight management, mental health, heat index v. WBGT, and the results of a medical services survey. The Executive Board also approved the implementation guidelines for CPR/AED training pending approval of Rule 10 changes by the Board of Directors.

CROSS COUNTRY MEET MANAGEMENT RECOMMENDATIONS

A work committee comprised of a subset of Sports Medicine Advisory Committee members and administrative staff developed a best practice protocol for hosting cross country meets. This protocol involved plans for spotters, finish chute layout, medical support, and cold water immersion tanks. The board approved the recommendation for those hosting meets to follow the best practices defined by this committee. Schools will receive the recommendations in the summer mailing and they will be posted on the Association website.

PREGAME TIME-OUT

The Executive Board received and discussed a tool designed to initiate and facilitate a discussion prior to all interscholastic activities between leadership team representatives from each participating school. The board approved recommendation for use of this pregame time-out prior to all contests. Schools will receive this information in the summer mailing and it will be posted on the Association website.

UNIQUE USER NAME AND PASSWORDS, ASSISTANT COACHES IN DATABASE

For the next school year, member school coaches will be provided unique user names and passwords. This will aid site security and increase accountability for head coaches. Additionally, schools will be able to add assistant coaches to the KSHSAA coaching roster for respective schools. This upgrade will allow for enhanced communication and development of young coaches.

NFHS NETWORK

The Executive Board approved a partnership agreement between the KSHSAA and the NFHS Network. This agreement provides the opportunity for broadcast access for all championship competitions to be available via web stream on the NFHS Network.

500-MILE RULE VIOLATION APPEAL

The Executive Board heard an appeal from St. Thomas Aquinas for the consequence imposed for a violation of the 500-mile Bylaw violation which was a result of the STA soccer team playing a school from Milwaukee, WI at a neutral site. The board rejected the appeal and supported the consequence imposed which includes forfeiture of the game played, a one-game reduction in the soccer schedule for the next spring season, and an administrative reprimand.

SIX-PLAYER FOOTBALL

The board continued discussion regarding appropriate next steps for 6-player football. The board will receive information from results of a survey of 1A schools determining their intent to compete in 11-player, 8-player, or 6-player football if offered in the next cycle. The board also discussed steps and requirements before 6-player football would be approved as a championship event.

FOOTBALL JAMBOREE

The Executive Board discussed and approved guidelines for the proposed football jamboree, contingent upon approval by the Board of Directors.

DATES FOR REGIONAL MUSIC FESTIVALS APPROVED

The Executive Board discussed and approved a scheduling philosophy which established music festivals in the southern half of the state be held during the first regional weekend, and those schools hosting the second week be in the northern half of the state. This change allows for more efficient use of judges during the traditional two weekends of music festivals.

INJURY UPDATE

The Executive Board received an update on two potentially catastrophic injuries sustained by member school track and field athletes. One athlete was hit in the head by a discus, and one athlete was impaled by a javelin. Both athletes were treated and are expected to recover with no long term issues as a result of these injuries. Member schools are reminded to follow best practices at practices and competitions in order to minimize risk for all throwing events.

VIDEO REPLAY OPTION FOR STATE FOOTBALL & STATE BASKETBALL

The Executive Board voted in opposition to the use of video replay. Such use is allowed in limited capacity by NFHS rules in championship competition when approved by state Association adoption.

SPORT TESTING/MEETING POLICIES FOR COACHES

Following discussion at the March meeting, staff prepared policy modifications for head coaches in all activities. After discussion, the Board determined the fine for failure to complete a test will increase to \$100. The fine for missing a mandatory rules meeting (offered online and in-person) will also increase to \$100. The success of this intervention will be monitored and if improvement is not recognized, staff will ask the Executive Board to consider temporary exclusion of coaches who fail to take their professional responsibilities seriously.

PRIVATE SCHOOL ACTION PLAN

At the March meeting, the Executive Board received and approved a plan to address concerns from member school leagues regarding success of private schools in postseason competition. The Board reviewed updated action steps and timeline.

KAY PRESENTATION

Cheryl Gleason provided an overview of the KAY program and the historic, current, and future impact KAY will have for our students and communities. She also updated the Executive Board on KAYAN and grant opportunities for KAY clubs.

KANSAS MUSIC EDUCATORS ASSOCIATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Kansas Music Educators Association (KMEA), represented by President Gae Phillips, Columbus; Mark Gard, Coffeyville-Field Kindley; Gretchen Bixler, Goddard-Eisenhower; and Dana Hamant, Friends University met with the Executive Board. While the KMEA had no proposals to present, the Executive Board expressed their thanks and appreciation for the efforts of KMEA to advance music education for the benefit of all Kansas students.

KANSAS SPEECH COMMUNICATIONS ASSOCIATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Kansas Speech Communications Association (KSCA), represented by Steve Harrell, Tonganoxie; Russ Tidwell, Garden City; Curtis Shephard, Maize; Melissa Reynolds, Shawnee Mission-Bishop Miege and Daniel Dawson, Lyons met with the Executive Board to present KSCA recommendations.

All recommendations were tabled until the June Executive Board meeting for final action. A list of the KSCA proposal items follows:

Proposal #1

Debate

Should prep time be increased to 8 minutes per team, per round?

Rationale:

- Overall, we saw that 80% of the coaches that responded voted in favor of this proposal while 20% of coaches voted against.

Proposal #2

Debate

Should the current language in Sec. 10 under "Regional and State Debate Tournaments" be replaced with the following language: "Speakers are allowed to give a "road map" of the order of their speeches before their speech time begins. A road map is NOT an introduction or an overview of the content of the arguments, it is simply the order of the debate for organizational purposes."

Rationale:

- Overall, we saw that 84.3% of the coaches that responded voted in favor of this proposal while 15.7% of coaches voted against.

KANSAS COACHES ASSOCIATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Kansas Coaches Association (KCA), represented by President Scot Koranda, Riverside; Ginny Honomichl, Baldwin City; Rod Clay, Horton; Jackie Hall, Uniontown; and Stan Boggs, Winfield; met with the Executive Board to present KCA recommendations.

All recommendations were tabled until the June Executive Board meeting for final action. A list of the KCA proposal items follows:

Proposal #1

Baseball

KSHSAA should change the Baseball playoff format to allow seeding to take place on Saturday rather than Wednesday for classes 4A, 5A, and 6A.

Tournament Format:

- Develop two groups based on geography with 18 schools in each group.
- On Saturday of SCW #45 seed tournament each half of the state 1-18
- Top 16 teams will be in the tournament bracket
- Each half of the state will have 4 groups of 4 that play with the winner advancing to the state tournament. Each site will play three games in one day.
 - o 1 v 16; 8 v 9 – winners play same day – winner advances to state
 - o 4 v 13; 5 v 12 – winners play same day – winner advances to state
 - o 2 v 15; 7 v 10 – winners play same day – winner advances to state
 - o 3 v 14; 6 v 11 – winners play same day – winner advances to state
- This same format will be followed by both east and west halves of the state
- Playing dates: SCW #46 – Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday
(Friday is the make-up day if weather is an issue)
- All games played at highest seed in the four-team bracket
- Seeds #17 and #18 may play each other so each school has an opportunity for 21 games. If both schools agree they do not wish to play this game, it will be cancelled.
- The #17 vs. #18 game will be played at the higher seed during SCW #46
- Tie breaking procedures in Baseball/Softball manual will be used
- 8 team qualify for state tournament in each class
- League Commissioners/Assigners will assign umpires for regional games

Rationale:

- 4A - 31 schools
5A - 24 schools
6A - 28 schools = 83 total schools (86%)
- Yes - 77 votes (93%)
No - 6 votes
- Concern in these classes has been expressed by coaches about not being able to have completed the 20-game schedule prior to the seeding date. Baseball coaches are concerned about the number of pitchers available if the tournament has to be played over a two-day period.

Proposal #2

Basketball

KSHSAA should change the Basketball playoff format to allow seeding to take place on Saturday rather than Wednesday for classes 4A, 5A, & 6A.

Tournament Format:

- Develop two groups based on geography with 18 schools in each group.
- Remember in all scenarios there are actually two tournaments taking place. (boys & girls)
- On Saturday of SCW #34 seed tournament each half of state 1-18. (both boys & girls)
- Top 16 teams will be in the tournament bracket.
- Each half of state will have 4 groups of 4 that play with the winner advancing to the state tournament.
 - o 1 v 16; 8 v 9 – winners play 2nd day – winner advances to state
 - o 4 v 13; 5 v 12 – winners play 2nd day – winner advances to state
 - o 2 v 15; 7 v 10 – winners play 2nd day – winner advances to state
 - o 3 v 14; 6 v 11 – winners play 2nd day – winner advances to state
- This same format will be followed by both East and West halves of the state
 - o Playing dates: Tuesday and Friday or Wednesday and Saturday
 - o Thursday is the make-up date if weather is an issue
 - o Alternate gender and class by year.
- All games played at higher seed
- Tiebreaking procedures in Basketball Manual will be used
- Seeds 17 and 18 may play each other so each school has an opportunity for 21 playing dates. If both schools agree they do not wish to play this game, it will be cancelled
- The 17 vs. 18 game will be played at the higher seed on Monday or Thursday of SCW #35.
- 8 teams qualify for state tournament in each class
- The KSHSAA will assign officials for all games played.

Rationale:

- *164 of 216 = 76% (all 4A-5A-6A coaches, Boys and Girls combined)*
- *Concern in these classes has been expressed by coaches about not being able to have completed the 20 game schedule prior to the seeding date.*

Proposal #3

Cross Country (Classes 6A, 5A, 4A, 3A and 2A only)

Four teams from each Regional should qualify for state.

5. If the "East-West" formula is used to determine which of the two schools will host, it will change odd and even years.

(Golf is allowed two all day meets and four meets with a 1pm start during the school week in the regular season. Tennis is asking for the same. At this time tennis is allowed six 3pm starts and two all day meets. Many larger, 16+ team tennis events are already scheduled for Saturdays so no class time is missed for these tournaments. The Saturday event will continue to be scheduled for tennis. Golf does not often use Saturdays/Sundays for high school events due to club members wanting the courses.)

- *Numerous school tennis sites, public parks, and clubs that are used to host tournaments have limited courts available, 4-6, and not all of the facilities have lights for all or any of the courts. On top of this, the travel time to and from meets is often two hours one-way in western KS, which has been and continues to be a safety concern with coaches driving their teams home close to midnight or after.*

Proposal #10

Tennis

To replace and reorganize the current team tiebreaking system in place for team ties at the state meets. The following 3-step process is what the 13 members of the tennis committee developed:

1. Total number of state medalists-the team with more entries earning medals breaks the tie. (a doubles team counts as one entry as does a singles player)
2. The team with the most points according to the current point scale for their state medalist only. (entries not advancing to Day 2 of State will not have their points included in the tiebreaking process)
3. Highest percentage of games won/games played will be tabulated for each team to break the tie (the current #1 in the tiebreaking process would move here to the #3 spot to break ties)

KANSAS ASSOCIATION OF SCHOLARS BOWL COACHES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Kansas Association of Scholars Bowl Coaches (KASBC), represented by Bert Lewis of Fort Scott High School, met with the Executive Board to submit proposals for consideration from the KASBC membership.

All recommendations were tabled until the June Executive Board meeting for final action. A list of the KASBC proposal items follows:

Proposal #1

Scholars Bowl Manual Language Change - Procedures for Visuals and Signaling Systems

Pencil and paper will be provided for each team, **but calculators will not be allowed.**

Prior to each round, a buzzer and visual check should be completed to assure equitable competition.

Visuals will be provided where necessary. They are to be printed on 12 x 18 11 x 17-inch white paper, which will be held up at the appropriate time in such a manner that they can be easily viewed by members of both teams.

When a buzzer sounds, the visual is to be turned downward immediately, and time stopped. If the answer given is incorrect, the visual is again shown to the second team and time restarted. The second team has the remaining time plus five seconds in which to respond.

OVERHEAD TRANSPARENCIES ARE NOT TO BE USED. ~~12 x 18~~ 11 x 17-inch poster board cards, clearly written, typed in a standardized font (Times New Roman, Arial) with a minimum of 64 point, are the approved method of providing visual cues.

Rationale:

- *Technical change. An issue with World Language questions needing resolution addresses font and paper size of signage. The 11x17 size paper is what is used in current copiers (not the old 12x18). The recommended font (Times New Roman or Arial) and text size (64 point) are regularly used now and provide a comfortable visual for reading. These specifications will also provide consistency for the category.*

Proposal #2

Handbook Rule 51, Section 2, Article 3 Change

Art. 3: No student may participate in more than eight nine scholars bowl competitions per year, exclusive of regional and state. On those days when school time is used, only two competitions may start prior to 3 p.m. C.T.

NOTE: Each student is limited to eight scholars bowl competitions, except that should his or her school host a league or invitational tournament, then he or she may participate in nine scholars bowl competitions. If a school attempts to host a tournament and is unable to do so, it may appeal to the Executive Board for a waiver of this regulation to permit its students to enter nine scholars bowl competitions.

Rationale:

- *This year, as in many of the past several years, KASBC has sent a regional survey to all the coaches in the state regarding ideas and possible changes to the rules. A common request from coaches each year is to increase the number of competitions allowed per year. For consistency, scholars bowl will use the same NOTE language as speech and debate whereas schools may gain one tournament if hosting a league or invitational tournament. This change would only provide one additional competition (total of nine) during the 26-week scholars bowl*

season. Currently, eight competitions are permitted during the 18-week speech season and the 22-week debate season. Thus, with most competition start times being 3:00 p.m. or later, very minimal learning time / school time will be missed. Plus, the new language provides an incentive for schools to host tournaments, hopefully, encouraging more schools to do so.

Proposal #3

Scholars Bowl Manual Language Change - Electronic Communication Devices

Use of electronic communication devices (including, but not limited to cell phones/smart phones, PDAs, tablets, computers, smart watches, digital recording devices) during a competition round is prohibited. Essential medical devices (such as insulin pumps, halter monitors, etc.) are not included in this rule. Participants may not use cell phones or other electronic communication devices during tournament play. When spectators enter competition rooms, all electronic devices must be turned off. A disruption caused by a team member due to any sounds from communication devices will result in disqualification of the team for said round. The disqualified team will receive zero points for the round and remaining team will finish the round vs. empty chairs.

Rationale:

- *This proposal clarifies what is considered an "electronic communication device" and what is not. There have been several complaints regarding the definition of "electronic communication device" in tournaments, and these changes should help clarify the situation.*

NEXT MEETING

President Britton Hart informed members should they wish to add an item to the agenda it could be done provided three-fourths of those present agreed.

Following public hearings, discussion and final actions on all agenda items, the Board adjourned at 6:10 p.m.

PUBLIC FORUM

Warren Seitz, Athletic Director of Seneca-Nemaha Central High School, spoke in favor of the modifications to Football Rule 35 and Seasons of Activities Rule 30, proposed by the Big Seven league to allow for football jamboree scrimmages prior to the start of the season.

Greg Hobelmann, Athletic Director at Smith Center High School, and Ryan Best, Golf Coach at Overland Park-St. Thomas Aquinas High School, both spoke in favor of the proposal for expanding the state golf tournaments from 18-holes to 36-holes by modifying Golf Rule 36.

Doug Kretzer, Wrestling coach from McPherson High School, spoke on behalf of the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association in favor of the proposal to modify Rules 44, Wrestling, and 23, Mixed Teams, to allow for a girls wrestling championship.

Jeremy Boldra, Superintendent of USD 492, Flinthills, addressed the board in support of his proposals to modify Rules 16, Semester Requirements, 17, Age Requirements, 18, Transfer, 22, Outside Competition, 26, Anti-Tryout and Private Instruction, 29, Cooperative Agreement, and 30, Seasons of Activities, in order to allow Jr. high/middle school students to play on club teams and/or high school teams.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Bill Faflick, Executive Director, called roll, presented remarks on the Association's financial position, and updated the members of the Board of Directors on business and policy matters of the Association.

SEPTEMBER 2018 MINUTES APPROVED

Motion by Lewis, second by Lane, to approve the Minutes of the meeting conducted September 12, 2018. The vote was 66 in favor, none opposed. Motion passed.

All agenda items approved become effective immediately upon publication of these minutes unless otherwise specified.

NOTE: Words or phrases which appear underlined in the following sections indicate the changes which were made.

ALL COACHES REQUIRED TO HAVE CPR AND AED TRAINING

Following discussion on the proposal, a motion was made by Perez, seconded by Kaiser, to add **Article 9 to Rule 10, Section 1** as follows:

Rule 10

Qualifications of Coaches (Athletic, Spirit, Scholars Bowl and Speech) and Music Directors

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 9: Any person serving in the role of a head or assistant sport coach/aide or a head or assistant activity sponsor/aide in a KSHSAA member school shall be certified or trained in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) administration.

The proposal was approved by a vote of 40 in favor, 26 opposed.

SCHOLARSHIP EXCEPTION GRANTED FOR FIRST SEMESTER 7TH AND 9TH GRADE STUDENTS

After introduction of the proposed scholarship requirement exceptions for 7th and 9th grade students, discussion regarding 9th grade eligibility led to a motion by Hines to amend the proposal by striking the Section 1, Article 3 Exception for the first semester of the 9th grade year. A second by Shaffer was made and the vote to amend failed by a vote of 13 in favor, 52 opposed.

A motion to adopt the proposal as originally presented, including the first semester of 9th grade year, was made by Means, second by Herman, modifying **Rule 13, Scholarship Requirements**, to include the following exceptions:

Rule 13

Scholarship Requirements

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 3: A student in grades 7-12 shall meet the following requirements for eligibility in interschool activities:

- a. Scholarship—The student shall have passed at least five new subjects (those not previously passed) of unit weight, or its equivalency, the previous semester or the last semester of attendance. (*See Rule 14-1-1, Bona Fide Student and Rule 15-1-3, Enrollment/Attendance.*)

EXCEPTION: The scholarship requirement would be waived for the first semester of the 7th grade year and the first semester of the 9th grade year. The student would be immediately eligible as long as all other eligibility requirements are met.

Section 3: Middle/Junior High School Regulations

Art. 1: Middle and junior high schools may elect to report scholastic eligibility on a quarterly basis, at the option of the local school. In that event, the student shall meet the following requirements for eligibility in interschool activities:

- a. Scholarship—The student shall have passed at least five new subjects (those not previously passed) of unit weight, or its equivalency, the previous quarter or the last quarter of attendance. (See *Rule 14-1-1, Bona Fide Student and Rule 15-1-3, Enrollment/Attendance.*)

EXCEPTION: The scholarship requirement would be waived for the first quarter of the 7th grade year. The student would be immediately eligible as long as all other eligibility requirements are met.

The vote was 42 in favor, 23 opposed. The proposal is approved.

FOOTBALL ‘JAMBOREE’ SCRIMMAGES APPROVED

Motion by Schroeder, second by McComas, to approve changes to **Rule 35, Football** and **Rule 30, Seasons of Activities, Section 1, Article 5** as follows:

Rule 35 Football (Boys)

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: No middle/junior or senior high school shall be represented in a game or scrimmage with any outside teams or group until it has had (JH/MS - 13, HS - 14) days of practice prior to (and not including) the first scheduled day of competition. (See *Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities.*)

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

Art. 1: All practices and games shall be held between the opening and closing of the regular-season, unless approved by the Executive Board. No senior high school shall be represented in a game with any outside teams or group until it has had 14 days of practice prior to (and not including) the first scheduled day of competition. No senior high school shall be represented in a scrimmage with any outside teams or group until it has had 10 days of practice prior to (and not including) the scrimmage. Each individual player shall participate in at least nine days of practice before their scrimmage. No senior high school shall participate in more than one scrimmage. (See *Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities.*)

No scrimmage shall be played except the one scheduled by, and entirely under the control of the principals of the participating schools or the Executive Board.

Section 3: Middle/Junior High School Regulations

Art. 1 If a middle/junior high school chooses to parallel the senior high school season, it shall follow the same rules regarding practice without pads.

Art. 2: No middle/junior high school shall be represented in a game with any outside teams or group until it has had 13 days of practice prior to (and not including) the first scheduled day of competition. No middle/junior high school shall be represented in a scrimmage with any outside teams. (See *Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities.*)

Art. 2 3: Each middle/junior high school team is limited to a maximum of seven (7) games during one season. No student shall participate in more than two games per week, or games on consecutive days, and may not participate in

more than four quarters in any one day.

NOTE: While this rule does not limit a player to an absolute maximum of seven games, including first team and reserve-team contests, care should be taken to protect the health and physical well-being of all participants.

EXCEPTION: Ninth grade students in junior high schools shall be permitted to compete in the same number of athletic competitions as ninth graders in senior high schools.

Art. 3 4: Games involving students from more than one grade shall be played in eight-minute quarters. Ten-minute quarters shall be played in games involving a combination of ninth and eighth and/or seventh grade students by mutual agreement of both schools.

NOTE: By mutual agreement of both schools, twelve-minute quarters may be used for games involving ninth graders or students eligible age-wise for ninth grade competition only.

Rule 30 Seasons of Activities

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 5: Interscholastic scrimmages (practices) in all activities shall be prohibited (Exception, see Rule 35-Football).

- a. Schools may not hold interschool scrimmages (practices) in athletics (Exception, see Rule 35-Football), scholars bowl or debate. Interscholastic is defined as middle/junior school with another middle/junior school and senior high school with another senior high school. This does not eliminate scrimmages between alumni and the school team.

During a scrimmage there can be no score kept and no clock. Use of officials is permitted. Should one or more game elements (score or time) be involved, it would no longer be a scrimmage, but must count toward the number of contests allowed during the season. Intra-squad scrimmages, games among teammates, even with score, time and/or officials used would not be considered a game.

In Gymnastics, Swimming and Diving and Track and Field (pole vault only) schools who employ the same coach or share facilities and equipment, may practice together and not be in violation of the prohibition on interschool scrimmage.

EXCEPTION: When combined with an interscholastic athletic event, it is permissible to conduct interschool scrimmages. (Illus: Fifth quarter in football and sixth quarter in basketball, etc. where the intent is to provide those not participating significantly in the interscholastic competition to have an opportunity to participate informally under modified game conditions.) Participation in a modified game condition (fifth quarter/6th quarter), as described above, would not count toward the four- or six-quarter limitation.

(KSHSAA Note: *Details of scrimmage limitations will be included in the KSHSAA Football Manual.*)

The vote was 62 in favor, 3 opposed. The proposal was approved.

GOLF CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENTS TO PLAY 36-HOLES

Motion by Stein, second by Hubbard, to modify **Rule 36, Golf, Section 1** and **Section 2, Articles 8-10** as follows:

Rule 36 Golf (Girls & Boys)

Section 1: General Regulations (none) (See Rule 30-1-8a-e, Seasons of Activities)

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

~~Art. 8:~~ Member schools may enter a maximum of six players in one of the state tournament series:

- a. The best four scores shall be totaled to determine the team championship.
- b. If a team qualifies for the state tournament, all six members shall qualify.
- c. If a school enters fewer than four players, they shall compete for individual medalist.

~~Art. 9 8:~~ After 18 Following up to 36 holes of medal play in state tournaments, championships shall be awarded. for low medalist and for the low medalist six-member team.

~~NOTE:~~ Ties for medalists shall be decided by a "sudden death" play-off.

~~Art. 10 9:~~ The Executive Board has the authority to revise the participation regulations and to establish regulations for outside tournament competition.

(KSHSAA Note: Details of the 36-hole tournament will be included in the KSHSAA Golf Manual.)

The vote was 54 in favor, 11 opposed. The proposal was approved.

GIRLS WRESTLING CHAMPIONSHIP MEET APPROVED

A request was made to modify **Rule 44, Wrestling**, to allow for girls wrestling as follows:

Rule 44 Wrestling (Girls & Boys)

Section 2: Senior High Regulations

Art. 4: Schools may enter one wrestler in each of the weight divisions as specified in the National Federation Rule Book. If weight divisions are not established by the NFHS, then the state association will establish weight divisions.

With the wrestling rule change approved, discussion was held regarding **Rule 23, Mixed Teams**. A motion was made by Hines, seconded by Lewis, to amend the proposed change by removing the sentence stating "If a competition only offers a boys division, then girls will have the option of competing in the boys division. If the competition offers both a boys and girls division, then girls are required to wrestle in the girls division." The amendment failed by a vote of 6 in favor, 59 opposed.

A motion was made by Backhus, seconded by Reed to approve the following change to Rule 23:

Rule 23 Mixed Teams

Section 1: General Regulations (none)

Art. 1: The mixed team rules is being waived for the 2019-20 and 2020-21 school years for the sport of wrestling. A two-year transition period is being granted to permit girls the option of participating in both their school's boy's lineup and girl's lineup during the regular season contests only. If a competition only offers a boys division, then girls will have the option of competing in the boys division. If the competition offers both a boys and girls division, then girls are required to wrestle in the girls division. After the two specified years, the mixed team rule will go into effect and girls will only participate against girls. From the start of implementation of Girls Wrestling, the girls must participate in the girls only postseason. No option is given to compete in the boys postseason.

The vote was 63 in favor, 2 opposed. The proposal was approved.

CHANGE TO SEMESTER REQUIREMENT LANGUAGE DENIED

A request was made to modify **Rule 16, Semester Requirements, Section 1, Article 1** as follows:

Rule 16 Semester Requirements

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: A student shall not have more than two semesters (the initial year of attendance) of possible eligibility in grade seven and two semesters in grade eight. Once the school determines that a student is promoted from eighth grade, high school eligibility begins immediately in the following semester. A student shall not have more than eight twelve consecutive semesters of possible eligibility in grades nine seven through twelve, regardless of whether the ninth grade is included in junior high or in a senior high school.

NOTE: If a student does not participate or is ineligible due to transfer, scholarship, etc., the semester(s) during that period shall be counted toward the total number of semesters possible. (*See Rule 30-1-1, Seasons of Activities.*)

The request was not advanced due to a lack of motion.

AGE REQUIREMENTS RULE CHANGE DENIED

A request was made to modify **Rule 17, Age Requirements, Section 3, Article 5** as follows:

Rule 17 Age Requirements

Section 3: Middle/Junior High School Regulations

Art. 5: A seventh, or eighth, grade junior high school student in a two-year junior high school, who has reached the age of 15 on or before August 1, or a ninth grade junior high school student may participate on a senior high school team with the approval of both principals provided both

schools are under the same board of education or school board. A student who moves up under the regulation shall be ineligible for further middle/junior high competition in that sport.

NOTE: If this rule is to apply, the middle/junior high school must be a member of the KSHSAA, as it relates to moving students from the seventh, eighth, (~~due to age~~) or the ninth grade up to the high school.

The request was not advanced due to a lack of motion.

TRANSFER RULE CHANGE DENIED

A request was made to modify **Rule 18, Transfer** as follows:

Rule 18 Transfer

A student is eligible transfer-wise if:

- **BEGINNING SEVENTH GRADER**—A seventh grader, at the beginning of his or her seventh grade year, is eligible under the Transfer Rule at any school he or she may choose to attend.
- **BEGINNING EIGHTH GRADER**—An eighth grader, at the beginning of his or her eighth grade year, is eligible under the Transfer Rule at any school he or she may choose to attend.
- **BEGINNING NINTH GRADERS IN A THREE-YEAR JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL**—So that ninth graders of a three-year junior high are treated equally to ninth graders of a four-year senior high school, a student who has successfully completed the eighth grade of a two-year middle /junior high school, may transfer to the ninth grade of a three-year junior high school at the beginning of the school year and be eligible immediately under the Transfer Rule. Such a ninth grader must then, as a tenth grader, attend the feeder senior high school of their school system. Should they attend a different school as a tenth grader, they would be ineligible for eighteen weeks.

Section 3: Middle/Junior High School Regulations

Art. 2: CHANGING SCHOOLS AFTER INITIAL YEAR—After a student is eligible as a seventh grader or in his or her initial year of middle/junior high school, he or she may ~~not change middle/junior high schools without forfeiting eighteen weeks of eligibility, unless there is a bona fide move on the part of the student's parents to a permanent residence in the vicinity of the new school to which the student transfers.~~

Art. 2: BEGINNING EIGHTH GRADER—An eighth grader, at the beginning of his or her eighth grade year, is eligible at any school he or she may choose to attend.

The request was not advanced due to a lack of motion.

OUTSIDE COMPETITION RULE CHANGE DENIED

A request was made to modify **Rule 22, Outside Competition, Section 1** as follows:

Rule 22 Outside Competition

Violation of this rule shall make a student ineligible for the remainder of that sport, scholars bowl or debate season, unless he or she is reinstated by the Executive Board.

Section 1: General Regulations (~~apply to grades 7-12 Senior High Participants~~)

The request was not advanced due to a lack of motion.

ANTI-TRYOUT AND PRIVATE INSTRUCTION RULE REMOVAL DENIED

A request was made to remove **Rule 26, Anti-Tryout and Private Instruction** as follows:

~~Rule 26 Anti-Tryout and Private Instruction~~

~~A student who violates this rule shall be ineligible in that activity for a period of one year from the date of the violation, unless reinstated by the Executive Board.~~

~~Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)~~

~~**Art. 1:** A student may receive instruction from their parent(s) at any time. A student's parent(s) may attend their student's private instruction session without violating the provisions of this rule.~~

~~**Art. 2:** A student may receive private instruction at any time of the school year. During the time a student is a member of a school athletic squad, starting with the student's first day of school practice and ending with the student's last day on the school athletic squad, a student may receive private instruction subject to the conditions set forth in this rule.~~

~~**Art. 3:** Other individuals may be present at a student's private instruction session as long as they are there in a supportive capacity only and not giving or providing instructions to the student.~~

~~**NOTE:** Private instruction is defined as one student receiving instruction from one person during the period of instruction. A group is defined as two or more students receiving instruction from an instructor during the same period of instruction. Supportive capacity is defined as participating in the period of instruction without providing any instruction to the student or instructor or in a competitive situation/ capacity. KSHSAA Handbook 35~~

~~**Doubles Tennis Exception:** Given the uniqueness of teamwork when playing doubles tennis, a doubles pair may receive private instruction and not be in violation. Once their school coach identifies a doubles team, those two doubles partners may participate in a private lesson together without violating this rule.~~

~~**Art. 4:** A student shall not participate in group training sessions or tryouts held by colleges or other outside agencies in a sport while he or she is a member of a school athletic team in that identical sport.~~

Exception: The Kansas Legislature in the 2011 session, enacted the following law:

~~“(a) The Kansas State High School Activities Association (KSHSAA) and its member high schools, and administrators, principals, coaches, teachers and other affiliated with such association and member high schools, shall not adopt any rules and regulations or interpret any existing rule and regulation in any manner which would prohibit a student athlete from training with any Kansas state high school league-sponsored sport or competition while the student athlete is participating in nonschool swimming athletic training or diving athletic training, or both, during the high school sport season and throughout the year if:~~

SEASONS OF ACTIVITIES RULE CHANGE DENIED

A request was made to modify **Rule 30, Seasons of Activities, Section 1, Article 1** as follows:

Rule 30 Seasons of Activities

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: A student shall not have more than ~~one~~ six seasons of possible eligibility in grades ~~seven and one season in grade eight~~. A student shall not have more than ~~four~~ seasons of possible eligibility in grades ~~9-12~~, nor participate in more than one season of the same activity in a school year, regardless of whether the ninth grade is included in junior high or in a senior high school.

NOTE: If a student is ineligible due to transfer, scholarship, etc., or elects not to participate, the season(s) during that period shall be counted toward the total number of seasons possible. Seasons missed are not preserved for participation at a later time. Transfer from another state with a different seasonal format, does not create an exception to this rule. (*See Rule 16-1-1, Semester Requirements.*)

Items approved by KSHSAA staff on behalf of the Executive Board were reviewed. ***A list of these items may be found at the end of these minutes.***

PUBLIC FORUM

No one was present seeking to address the Executive Board.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS AND UPDATES

The Executive Board heard reports from the Executive Director and administrative staff regarding the status of programs and services of the Association. Staff reported key communications regarding general operations, including the conclusion of the spring activities season. The Executive Director provided a financial report, and Elizabeth Young of Clayton Wealth Partners provided an update on Association investments.

BUDGET HEARING AUTHORIZED

The Executive Board authorized a budget hearing to be held on Wednesday, September 18, 2019, at 11:30 a.m. in the office of the KSHSAA. The Association budget for the 2019-20 school year will be finalized at that time. Interested parties are welcome to attend.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION OFFICER APPOINTED

To ensure the KSHSAA remains in compliance with the Kansas Open Records Law, the Executive Board voted to designate the Executive Director or his designee, as the "Freedom of Information Officer." Additionally, the Executive Director or his designee will serve as the "Custodian of the Records" for purposes of the Open Records Law.

HALL OF FAME COMMITTEE MEMBERS SELECTED

Martha Gabel, Olathe, and Gerald Henderson, McPherson, were appointed to the Hall of Fame Selection Committee. They will replace Leticia Nielson, Wichita, and Brad Smith, Altamont, who have completed four-year terms on the committee. Jean Ney, Kansas City, was appointed to serve as chair of the committee for 2019-20.

UNDUE INFLUENCE

The Board received a summary of the investigation and actions of a member school following the report of undue influence regarding a high school football player transfer.

STATE SPEECH GRIEVANCE UPDATE

The Board received a summary of multiple grievances filed during the 3A State Speech Championship and subsequent action by event staff and member school administration.

PUBLIC – PRIVATE DISCUSSION

The Board received a summary of recent correspondences between the Association and member schools, as well as community members, regarding public and private school concerns. Additionally, they received an end-of-year summary of championships, as well as a summary of changes made by other states addressing public/private championship disparity. An update on intended next steps was discussed, including a plan to attend member school league meetings during the upcoming school year.

FOOTBALL PLAYOFFS

The board received the results of an unbinding survey of all 1A and 2A schools indicating probable football competition level for the next district assignment cycle. A review of those intending to compete as 6-Player, 8-Player, or 11-Player teams was provided. The Executive Board directed staff to develop a plan to allow for possibility of 6-Player championships for the next cycle, and to present such plan at the September Executive Board meeting.

CPR/AED TRAINING FOR COACHES/ SPONSORS

Based upon feedback provided to staff from member schools and following discussion, the Executive Board approved the following language be added to the existing CPR/AED training protocol effective with the upcoming 2019-20 school year:

“Following an initial 30-day grace period from the start of the season, personnel are not eligible to work as a coach or sponsor for their school until proof of completion of CPR/AED training is on file with their school.”

NO CHANGE FOR TENNIS HEADWEAR

Executive Board members discussed the existing policy regarding players wearing caps, visors, and bandanas in tennis matches. They affirmed existing policy which allows players to wear caps and visors, but caps and visors may not be worn backwards or sideways. Bandanas are not permitted.

SPEECH MANUAL FEES UPDATED

The Executive Board approved elimination of the \$10 school regional entry fee for Speech tournaments. They approved an increase to the regional and state festival fees from \$10 to \$12 and the State Champs entry fee from \$11 to \$12 per entry.

BOWLING MANUAL UPDATED

Updates to the Bowling Manual were approved and include further definition on bowler attire, as well as language addressing a late/ill bowler and a procedure to address scoring/clerical errors.

SOCCER MANUAL UPDATED

The Executive Board approved revised seeding criteria for postseason, which now includes “goals allowed” as additional criteria.

VOLLEYBALL MANUAL UPDATED

The Executive Board approved procedures for the 20-minute and 10-minute warm-ups for all postseason volleyball. Starting this fall, the following will be in place for 20-minute warm-ups:

Four (4) minutes of shared court time for ball handling
Four (4) minutes for home team use of the court
Four (4) minutes for visiting team use of the court

Four (4) minutes for home team use of the court (hitting / serving)

Four (4) minutes for visiting team use of the court (hitting / serving)

Starting this fall, the following will be in place for 10-minute warm-ups:

Two (2) minutes of shared court time for ball handling

Four (4) minutes for home team use of the court (hitting / serving)

Four (4) minutes for visiting team use of the court (hitting / serving)

LOSS OF INSTRUCTIONAL TIME SURVEY APPROVED

The Executive Board approved the Loss of Instructional Time Survey for distribution to member schools for data collection during the 2019-20 school year. This maintains the approved 4-year cycle of recording time lost for students and coaches/sponsors involved in the school activity program.

WRESTLING WEIGHT MANAGEMENT PROTOCOL DISCUSSED

In addition to approving 11 weight classes for girls wrestling (to be specifically defined at the September 2019 Executive Board meeting), the Executive Board discussed weigh-in procedures and the Kansas policy regarding weight management for wrestlers. The Executive Board agreed that further discussion and review should take place prior to changing all weigh-ins to a shoulder to shoulder protocol, to be compliant with NFHS rules. Additionally, the Board discussed the weight management protocol in place including alpha weigh-ins, certification timeline, and the existing weight descent plan.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR EVALUATION/ CONTRACT

The officers of the Executive Board reviewed and finalized the comprehensive evaluation of the Executive Director and presented results to the Executive Board during Executive Session. Following the Executive Session, the board approved recommendations for salary and contract extension of the Executive Director.

ADVISORY GROUP RECOMMENDATIONS

Each year, the Kansas Association of Scholar's Bowl Coaches (KASBC), the Kansas Coaches Association (KCA), the Kansas Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (KIAAA), the Kansas Music Educators Association (KMEA), and the Kansas Speech Communications Association (KSCA), survey their membership and develop proposals. These recommendations are tabled and published in the April Executive Board meeting minutes to allow member schools to discuss them and provide feedback. Final discussion and action on all recommendations is undertaken in the June meeting by the Executive Board.

Recommendations Adopted

The following recommendations, submitted by various advisory groups were approved by the Executive Board:

Baseball/Softball

1. (**Classes 6A, 5A, and 4A**) KSHSAA should change the Baseball playoff format to allow seeding to take place on Saturday rather than Wednesday for classes 4A, 5A, and 6A. (**KCA**)

Tournament Format:

- Develop two groups based on geography with 18 schools in each group.
- On Saturday of SCW #45 seed tournament each half of the state 1-18
- Top 16 teams will be in the tournament bracket
- Each half of the state will have 4 groups of 4 that play with the winner advancing to the state tournament. Each site will play three games in one day.
 - o 1 v 16; 8 v 9 – winners play same day – winner advances to state
 - o 4 v 13; 5 v 12 – winners play same day – winner advances to state
 - o 2 v 15; 7 v 10 – winners play same day – winner advances to state

- o 3 v 14; 6 v 11 – winners play same day – winner advances to state
- This same format will be followed by both east and west halves of the state
- Playing dates: SCW #46 – Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday
(Friday is the make-up day if weather is an issue)
- All games played at highest seed in the four-team bracket
- Seeds #17 and #18 may play each other so each school has an opportunity for 21 games. If both schools agree they do not wish to play this game, it will be cancelled.
- The #17 vs. #18 game will be played at the higher seed during SCW #46
- Tie breaking procedures in Baseball/Softball manual will be used
- 8 team qualify for state tournament in each class
- League Commissioners/Assigners will assign umpires for regional games

Rationale:

- *Concern in these classes has been expressed by coaches about not being able to have completed the 20-game schedule prior to the seeding date. Baseball coaches are concerned about the number of pitchers available if the tournament has to be played over a two-day period.*

Basketball

2. **(Classes 6A, 5A, and 4A)** KSHSAA should change the Basketball playoff format to allow seeding to take place on Saturday rather than Wednesday for classes 4A, 5A, & 6A. **(KCA)**

Tournament Format:

- Develop two groups based on geography with 18 schools in each group.
- Remember in all scenarios there are actually two tournaments taking place. (boys & girls)
- On Saturday of SCW #34 seed tournament each half of state 1-18. (both boys & girls)
- Top 16 teams will be in the tournament bracket.
- Each half of state will have 4 groups of 4 that play with the winner advancing to the state tournament.
 - o 1 v 16; 8 v 9 – winners play 2nd day – winner advances to state
 - o 4 v 13; 5 v 12 – winners play 2nd day – winner advances to state
 - o 2 v 15; 7 v 10 – winners play 2nd day – winner advances to state
 - o 3 v 14; 6 v 11 – winners play 2nd day – winner advances to state
- This same format will be followed by both East and West halves of the state
 - o Playing dates: Tuesday and Friday or Wednesday and Saturday
 - o Thursday is the make-up date if weather is an issue
 - o Alternate gender and class by year.

- All games played at higher seed
- Tiebreaking procedures in Basketball Manual will be used
- Seeds 17 and 18 may play each other so each school has an opportunity for 21 playing dates. If both schools agree they do not wish to play this game, it will be cancelled
- The 17 vs. 18 game will be played at the higher seed on Monday or Thursday of SCW #35.
- 8 teams qualify for state tournament in each class
- The KSHSAA will assign officials for all games played.

Rationale:

- *Concern in these classes has been expressed by coaches about not being able to have completed the 20-game schedule prior to the seeding date.*

Debate

3. Should prep time be increased to 8 minutes per team, per round? **(KSCA)**

Rationale:

- *Overall, we saw that 80% of the coaches that responded voted in favor of this proposal while 20% of coaches voted against.*

4. Should the current language in Sec. 10 under “Regional and State Debate Tournaments” be replaced with the following language: “Speakers are allowed to give a “road map” of the order of their speeches before their speech time begins. A road map is NOT an introduction or an overview of the content of the arguments, it is simply the order of the debate for organizational purposes.” **(KSCA)**

Rationale:

- *Overall, we saw that 84.3% of the coaches that responded voted in favor of this proposal while 15.7% of coaches voted against.*

Football

5. **(8-Player)** Adjust playoff hosting as follows:

The first round host (week #9) will always be the district winner and runner-up.

The higher seeded team will host the regional playoff game (2nd round, week #10)

Week #11, Sectional Round: The number of times a school has hosted a playoff game this year is the first factor considered in determining a host site between two schools BEFORE considering the “East-West” formula.

Week #12, Sub-State Round: go back to step 2, the higher seed will host. If both teams are of the same seed, then step 3 and 5 will be in effect.

If the “East-West” formula is used to determine which of the two schools will host, it will change odd and even years. **(KCA)**

Rationale:

- *A team’s overall body of work throughout the season and district play should be rewarded in the Sub-State Championship game; therefore, the higher seeded team in the Sub-State Round should carry more weight and should be the host school.*

6. **(11-Player)** Two teams would change seeds next to each other in a tie on record, even if one team won the points tie breaker, if the two teams had played head to head and the lower seed won. **(KCA)**

- *With this change if Team C and Team D played head to head and Team D won, they would go ahead and flip the two in the seeding for play-offs as long as it didn't change the seed of any other school.*

Scholars Bowl

7. Should a change be made to the Scholars Bowl manual for the section “Procedures for Visuals and Signaling Systems” as underlined below? **(KASBC)**

Pencil and paper will be provided for each team, **but calculators will not be allowed.**

Prior to each round, a buzzer and visual check should be completed to assure equitable competition.

Visuals will be provided where necessary. They are to be printed on ~~12 x 18~~ 11 x 17-inch white paper, which will be held up at the appropriate time in such a manner that they can be easily viewed by members of both teams.

When a buzzer sounds, the visual is to be turned downward immediately, and time stopped. If the answer given is incorrect, the visual is again shown to the second team and time restarted. The second team has the remaining time plus five seconds in which to respond.

OVERHEAD TRANSPARENCIES ARE NOT TO BE USED. ~~12 x 18~~ 11 x 17-inch poster board cards, clearly written, typed in a standardized font (Times New Roman, Arial) with a minimum of 64 point, are the approved method of providing visual cues.

Rationale:

- *Technical change. An issue with World Language questions needing resolution addresses font and paper size of signage. The 11x17 size paper is what is used in current copiers (not the old 12x18). The recommended font (Times New Roman or Arial) and text size (64 point) are regularly used now and provide a comfortable visual for reading. These specifications will also provide consistency for the category.*

8. Should a change be made to the Scholars Bowl manual for the section “**Electronic Communication Devices**” as underlined below? **(KASBC)**

Use of electronic communication devices (including, but not limited to cell phones/smart phones, PDAs, tablets, computers, smart watches, digital recording devices) during a competition round is prohibited. Essential medical devices (such as insulin pumps, halter monitors, etc.) are not included in this rule.

~~Participants may not use cell phones or other electronic communication devices during tournament play.~~ When spectators enter competition rooms, all electronic devices must be turned off. A disruption caused by a team member due to any sounds from communication devices will result in disqualification of the team for said round. The disqualified team will receive zero points for the round and remaining team will finish the round vs. empty chairs.

Rationale:

- *This proposal clarifies what is considered an “electronic communication device” and what is not. There have been several complaints regarding the definition of “electronic communication device” in tournaments, and these changes should help clarify the situation.*

Tennis

9. Replace and reorganize the current team tiebreaking system in place for team ties at the state meets. **(KCA)**

The following 3-step process is what the 13 members of the tennis committee developed:

1. Total # of state medalists-the team with more entries earning medals breaks the tie. (a doubles team counts as one entry as does a singles player)
2. The team with the most points according to the current point scale for their state medalist only. (entries not advancing to Day 2 of State will not have their points included in the tiebreaking process)
3. Highest % of games won/games played will be tabulated for each team to break the tie (the current #1 in the tiebreaking process would move here to the #3 spot to break ties)

Rationale:

- *To simplify the team tiebreaking process for tournament administrators hosting state meets and organizing the awards ceremony. It also eliminates matches NOT played from being figured in the equation.*
- *(Teams involved in the tie may or may not have the same number of entries competing at state, may or may not have the same number of matches contested.)*

Volleyball

10. Should the KSHAA change their procedure of how volleyball warm-ups should be conducted during the regular and postseason to a format that would allow only one team on the court at a time? (This would be a change from the current rule cited in the volleyball manual pg. 19 “Warm-up Procedures”). **(KIAAA)**

Items Referred To Board of Director Meeting

The following recommendations, which were submitted by advisory groups, will be submitted for consideration at the next Board of Directors meeting:

General

1. Should the KSHSAA change the transfer ineligibility rule to be expanded from 18 weeks to one calendar year for students not be eligible per terms of bona fide move, hardship or limited eligibility? **(KIAAA)**
2. Should the KSHSAA change **Outside Competition Rule 22 Section 1, Article 1** to read: "A student who is a member of a school athletic, scholars bowl, or debate squad, effective Tuesday following Labor Day Monday SCW #7 through Friday preceding Memorial Day, may not participate as a member of an outside team or as an independent competitor in the same sport, scholars bowl or debate activity. (Exception: See Rule 4, USOC Sponsored National Trials and Competitions.)" **(KIAAA)**

Scholars Bowl

3. Should a change be made to **Handbook Rule 51, Section 2, Article 3** as underlined below? **(KASBC)**

Art. 3: No student may participate in more than eight nine scholars bowl competitions per year, exclusive of regional and state. On those days when school time is used, only two competitions may start prior to 3 p.m. C.T.

NOTE: Each student is limited to eight scholars bowl competitions, except that should his or her school host a league or invitational tournament, then he or she may participate in nine scholars bowl competitions. If a school attempts to host a tournament and is unable to do so, it may appeal to the Executive Board for a waiver of this regulation to permit its students to enter nine scholars bowl competitions.

Rationale:

- This year, as in many of the past several years, KASBC has sent a regional survey to all the coaches in the state regarding ideas and possible changes to the rules. A common request from coaches each year is to increase the number of competitions allowed per year. For consistency, scholars bowl will use the same NOTE language as speech and debate whereas schools may gain one tournament if hosting a league or invitational tournament. This change would only provide one additional competition (total of nine) during the 26-week scholars bowl season. Currently, eight competitions are permitted during the 18-week speech season and the 22-week debate season. Thus, with most competition start times being 3:00 p.m. or later, very minimal learning time/school time will be missed. Plus, the new language provides an incentive for schools to host tournaments, hopefully, encouraging more schools to do so.

Items Referred To Fall Regional Administrators and Board of Education Meetings

The following recommendations, which were submitted by advisory groups, will be submitted for consideration at the Fall Regional Administrators and Board of Education Meetings:

Baseball/Softball

1. Should the KSHSAA change the playoff format that puts the state into 4 - 16-team seeded quadrants, and seed into 2 - 8-team sub-states? **(KIAAA)**

Football

2. Should the KSHSAA establish a playoff format that would seed the remaining 32 teams after district play into 2 - 16-team brackets (East-West)? **(KIAAA)**

Tennis

3. Use the annual classifications released in late September for the two seasons in the next calendar year. For example, the 2018 classifications released in late September would be used for both 2019 seasons (boys' and girls'). **(KCA)**

Rationale:

- Tennis has the shortest season of any KSHSAA sport and 2/3 of the fall season is complete before the statewide school headcount is take on Sept. 20. Classifications and regional assignments are not made public for tennis until one week after the headcount, which gives coaches and players only 1 week before regional competition. Due to this time crunch it is difficult for the coaches from schools to find tournaments to compete in that may fluctuate from 6A to 5A, 3-2-1A to 4A, etc.
 - **Assignments usually released 9/26 (SCW#13), reg. play is SCW#14.**
4. Bump up four of the current six 3 p.m. start to 1 p.m. during the school week for regular season tournaments. (Golf is allowed two all day meets and four meets with a 1 p.m. start during the school week in the regular season. Tennis is asking for the same. At this time tennis is allowed six 3 p.m. starts and two all day meets. Many larger, 16+ team tennis events are already scheduled for Saturdays so no class time is missed for these tournaments. The Saturday event will continue to be scheduled for tennis. Golf does not often use Saturdays/Sundays for high school events due to club members wanting the courses.) **(KCA)**

Rationale:

- Numerous school tennis sites, public parks, and clubs that are used to host tournaments have limited courts available, 4-6, and not all of the facilities have lights for all or any of the courts. Fewer courts means longer tournaments. Weather delays can also extend tennis meets further into the evening. This is especially true of smaller schools in western Kansas. On top of this, the travel time to and from meets is often two hours one-way in western KS, which has been and continues to be a safety concern with coaches driving their teams home close to midnight or after.
5. Should the KSHAA change the reading of **Rule 5** to include girls tennis to be based off the previous school years enrollment for classification purposes? **(KIAAA)**

Volleyball

6. Should the KSHSAA change the playoff format that puts the state into 4 - 16-team seeded quadrants, and seed into 2 – 8-team sub-states? **(KIAAA)**

Recommendations Denied

The Executive Board voted to deny the following recommendations, which were submitted by various advisory groups, etc.:

Basketball

1. **(Classes 6A and 5A)** Should the KSHSAA change the basketball playing dates to allow seeding to take place on Saturday rather than Wednesday for Classes 6A and 5A? **(KIAAA)**

Cross Country

2. **(Classes 6A, 5A, 4A, 3A and 2A only)** Four teams from each Regional should qualify for state. **(KCA)**
3. **(Class 1A only)** There should be 4 regionals instead of the 3 now in place. **(KCA)**
4. **(Class 1A only)** Five teams should qualify for state if there are 3 regionals; or 4 teams if there are 4 regionals. **(KCA)**

Football

5. Should the KSHSAA change their procedure for gate distribution for Regionals and Sub-state as currently listed in section VII of the football manual with regard to Ticket and Financial Report Information for Game Managers to read: **(KIAAA)**

“Host school receives 25% of net receipts (gate receipts minus sales tax) plus all concessions and program sales. The traveling school receives 15% of net receipts. Officials’ fees are paid prior to balance being sent to KSHSAA.”

Tennis

6. A second state team runner-up trophy will be supplied by KSHSAA in case of a team tie. The third-place trophy would be returned to KSHSAA. In the event of a two-way team tie for third-place, a second third-place trophy would be provided by KSHSAA. All three-way team ties for 2nd or 3rd place will be broken by the established tiebreaking system in the KSHSAA Tennis Manual. All two-way ties for the team title will be broken using the established tiebreaking system. **(KCA)**

**For reference: Wrestling does not break team ties for 2nd or 3rd places. Tennis is proposing the same procedure for breaking two-way team ties at the state meets.

Rationale:

- *To simplify the current team tiebreaking system in place at the state meets and honor the points each entry earned for their team in order to be in the tie situation.*

Volleyball

7. KSHSAA should offer 6 sites for the state tournament. **(KCA)**

Rationale:

- *All classifications can start and end at a reasonable time.*

General

8. Should the KSHAA change the transfer eligibility rule to include students going to a school where their club coach is on staff, without terms of bona fide move, hardship or limited eligibility; be deemed ineligible for one-calendar year? **(KIAAA)**

No Action Items

The Executive Board took no action on the following items, because it is existing policy or because no action is necessary.

General

1. Should the KSHSAA allow Kansas high schools to have the option to replace their current Gatorade/Soap Scrimmage with a scrimmage between 1 to 3 other high schools? **(KIAAA)**
