Who are the Officials?

There are 713 officials registered to officiate volleyball in Kansas this year. This number is down over 100 officials from the previous year.

Officials for the state volleyball tournaments are selected by the Kansas State High School Activities Association based upon the recommendations of high schools playing volleyball throughout the state. All officials selected to work in the state volleyball tournaments are registered. They also must have completed an open-book examination with a score above 90 percent, have attended an Association-sponsored mechanics meeting and additional meetings conducted by nine area supervisors of volleyball officials throughout Kansas. There are a total of 35 officials selected to work the seven state volleyball tournaments. These officials represent various geographic areas of the state and have received the greatest number of recommendations from member schools.

In order to achieve consistency and uniformity in rule interpretations and officiating mechanics, the Kansas State High School Activities Association requires that each official register with the state office, take a written open-book examination each year and attend additional meetings conducted by area supervisors.

Upon registering, officials receive rules books, case books and other related study materials. Officials, along with coaches, must also attend a rules meeting conducted by Association staff. At these meetings, study aids such as films, transparencies, interpretations and outlines are used to train both new and experienced officials.

There are a number of disadvantages which all officials must learn to accept. These include traveling and officiating under adverse weather conditions, criticism from spectators, coaches and players, and many hours of meetings and examinations. Contrary to popular opinion, game rules are often difficult to read, understand and interpret. An official must be willing to devote a great deal of time to studying and mastering these rules in the proper officiating techniques.

The modest fees which a high school official receives never fully compensate for the time and effort expended. For most, officiating is an avocation for the person who loves the game and wishes to contribute an important service to the players, coaches and spectators involved in interscholastic activities.

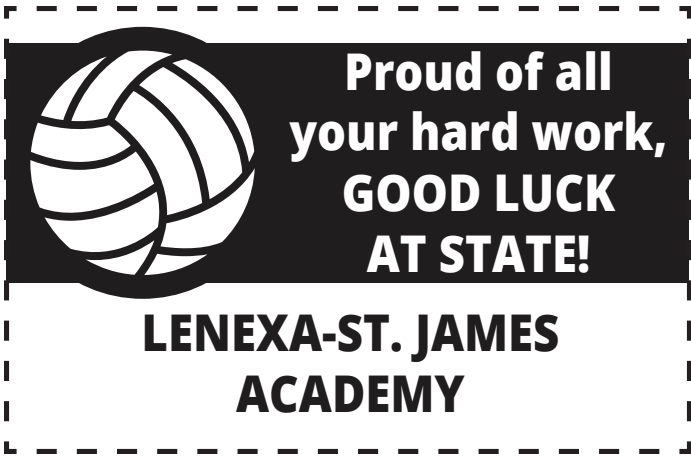
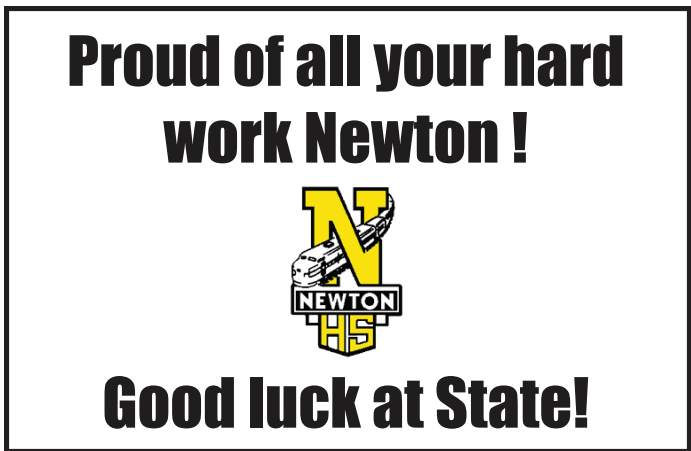

National Anthem Decorum

Schools are reminded and encouraged to remind their coaches, athletes and spectators of the appropriate conduct during the playing of the National Anthem as outlined in Title 36, section 1, paragraph 301 of the United States Code.

- - -

During a rendition of the National Anthem (when the flag is displayed):

- (A) Individuals in uniforms should give the military salute at the first note of the anthem and maintain that position until the last note;
- (B) Members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present but not in uniform may render the military salute in the manner provided for individuals in uniforms; and
- (C) All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, and men not in uniform, if applicable, should remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart.

When the flag is not displayed, all present should face towards the music and act in the same manner they would if the flag was displayed.

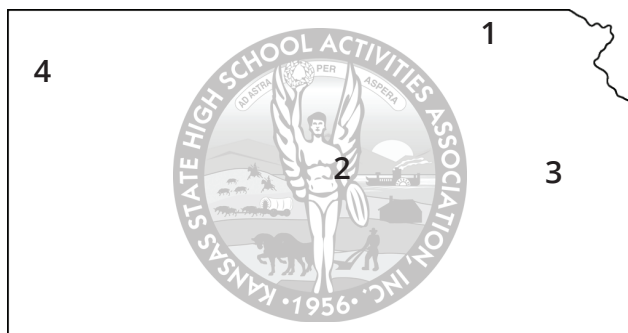

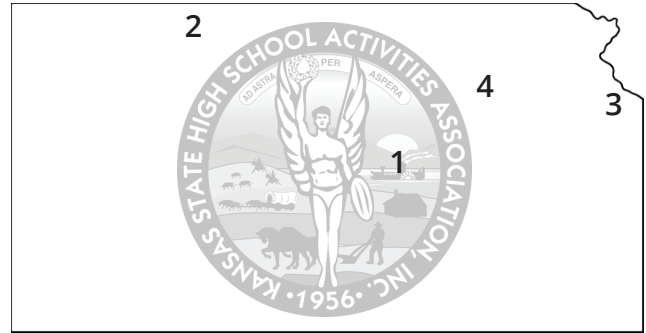

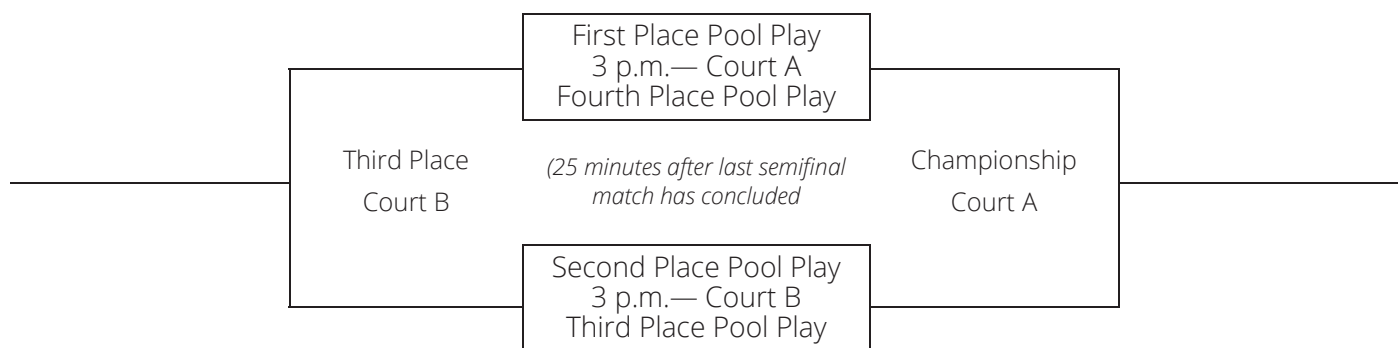

2020 MARKS THE 50TH KSHSAA STATE TOURNAMENT SERIES

GROWTH OF GIRLS' PARTICIPATION IN PAST 50 YEARS

The first KSHSAA State Volleyball Tournament was conducted in October 1971, nine months before the passage of Title IX. During the 1971-1972 school year the high school girls' athletic participation numbers across the country were 294,015. Two years later the numbers increased 42% to 1,300,169. During the 2017-2018 school year girls' participation numbers reached an all-time high of 3,415,306. During the 2017-2018 school year in Kansas, volleyball participation numbers were 8,372 followed by track and field at 7,304 and girls basketball at 6,625.

HISTORY/CHANGES

Volleyball has come a long way from the dusty old YMCA gymnasium of Holyoke, Massachusetts, USA, where the visionary William G. Morgan **invented** the sport back in 1895. Morgan, a graduate of the Springfield College of the YMCA, designed the game to be a combination of basketball, baseball, tennis and handball. The first volleyball net, borrowed from tennis, was only 6 ft. 6 in. high (though you need to remember that the average American was shorter in the 19th century).

The offensive style of setting and spiking was first demonstrated in the Philippines in 1916. Over the years that followed, it became clear that standard rules were needed for tournament play, and thus the USVBA (United States Volleyball Association) was formed in 1928.

The sport of volleyball has seen tremendous changes through the years. Since 2000 the two biggest changes have been the change from side-out scoring to rally scoring (2004) and the addition of the libero player (2006).

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS

The KSHSAA had intentions of conducting special events during this 50th year – however, they have been put on hold until next year.

Since mid-March, the COVID-19 pandemic has caused great change in our daily lives. We are pleased that our Kansas students have been able to return to the classroom and participate in school activities once again. While things are different – with social distancing, masks and hygiene protocols in place – there is a resounding feeling of thankfulness that some degree of normalcy is returning.

We are hopeful for a return to our former regular and postseason format in 2021.

Girls State Volleyball Tournament History

50th Year

The first state volleyball tournament under the direction of the KSHSAA was held at Wichita-North High School on October 29, 1971. Schools competed in three classes with Wichita-Bishop Carroll winning the Class 5-4-3A championship. Washington High School won the Class 2A championship and Winona-Triplains won the 1A title.

Schools competed in three classes through the 1972 season. In 1973 through 1976 competition was in four classes: 5-4A, 3A, 2A and 1A. In 1977 all five classes competed in their class. The KSHSAA grew to six classes in 1978 and all six classes were represented in their class. With the six classes came the following breakdown in schools per class: Class 6A included 32 high schools with the largest enrollment, Class 5A the next 32, Class 4A the next 64, Class 3A the next 64, Class 2A the next 64 and Class 1A the remaining schools.

The format for qualification to the state tournament has remained basically the same over the years with all classes but 1A qualifying the winner of the sub-state tournament to state. Since sub-states numbered eight in each class, eight teams advanced to state. In the case of Class 1A, because of the number of schools involved, a regional level of competition was required, qualifying teams for sub-state, with eight sub-state winners advancing to state as in all other classes.

From the beginning, 1971 until 1982, the state tournament selected the champion through an eight-team single elimination tournament. Starting with the 1983 tournaments, pool play was introduced to replace single elimination. With the introduction of pool play the top two teams in each half of the bracket were determined by round robin play. The final four teams then finished the tournament semifinals, consolation and championship.

In 1991, a new format was introduced requiring the four sub-state winners of Classes 4A, 3A, 2A and 1A attend state quarterfinal tournaments for East and West. This required an extra Saturday to complete the state championship. The top two teams from the East and West state quarterfinals in Classes 4A, 3A, 2A and 1A then advanced to the state volleyball final four, held the following Saturday, to determine a state champion for each class.

In 1992, the format was changed to a two-day tournament (Friday-Saturday) with two classes at each of the three state sites. Pool play competition was played on Friday for both classes. The top four teams in each class then finished the tournament semifinals, consolation and championship matches on Saturday.

In 2008, Class 1A schools began competing in two separate divisions. Following annual classification and determination of schools assigned to Class 1A, the half of the schools with the larger enrollments were assigned to Division I and the half with smaller enrollments were assigned to Division II. If Class 1A had an odd number of schools, Division I was assigned one more school than Division II. With this change in Class 1A, a fourth state tournament site was secured.

In 2013, the Class 4A schools began competing in two divisions, thus bringing the number of state volleyball tournaments to eight. After the annual classification of schools, the 64 schools identified as Class 4A were divided into two divisions. The 32 schools with the larger enrollments were assigned to Division I and 32 schools with the smaller enrollments were assigned to Division II. With this change, each state site conducted two state tournaments.

In 2018, the school classification system was modified and changed back to six classes/groups, with the largest schools remaining in class 6A and the smallest schools in class 1A. The 6A, 5A, and 4A groupings will have 36 schools each; the 3A, 2A groupings will each have 64 schools; and the remaining schools will be identified as class 1A (approximately 117 schools). With this change, the 1A schools return to regional qualifying tournaments (divided into four quadrants with four tournaments in each), qualifying the top two teams to their area sub-state tournament. The top two teams are placed in opposite 4-team brackets with the winners advancing to the state tournament (eight schools). The 2A and 3A schools will compete in eight sub-states of eight schools with the winner of each tournament earning a trip to state action (eight schools each). Classes 4A, 5A and 6A are each placed in two groups of 18 with each group conducting four sub-states of 4-5 schools. The top four seeds earn the opportunity to host these state qualifying tournaments. The winner of each sub-state tournament will qualify for their classification's state tournament (eight schools each).

In 2020, the school classification system was once again modified and changed to seven classes, with the split of the 1A schools into two division. The half of the schools with the larger enrollment were assigned to Division I and the half with the smaller enrollments were assigned to Division II. If Class 1A has an odd number of schools, Division I will be assigned one more school than Division II.

MODIFICATIONS IN 2020

The coronavirus pandemic has impacted Kansas schools both academic and activities programs. With support of the NFHS & KSHSAA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee, the following modifications have been put in place for this season:

- Sub-State groupings (all classes) – participating schools were grouped geographically into 8 groups per classification.
- Quarterfinal groupings (all classes) – winners of sub-state tournaments will play 1 match (3 out of 5 sets) with the winner advancing to the state tournament. Each sub-state was numbered 1-8; the winner of the even-numbered sub-states will host the quarterfinal match (1@2, 3@4, 5@6, 7@8).
- State Tournament Format (all classes) – 4 teams/schools will advance to the state tournament. The four teams will be seeded 1-4. Pool play will take place after which the four teams will be re-seeded based on their pool play results. Semi-final matches: 1 vs. 4, 2 vs. 3. The winners will play for the championship; the losers will play for third place.

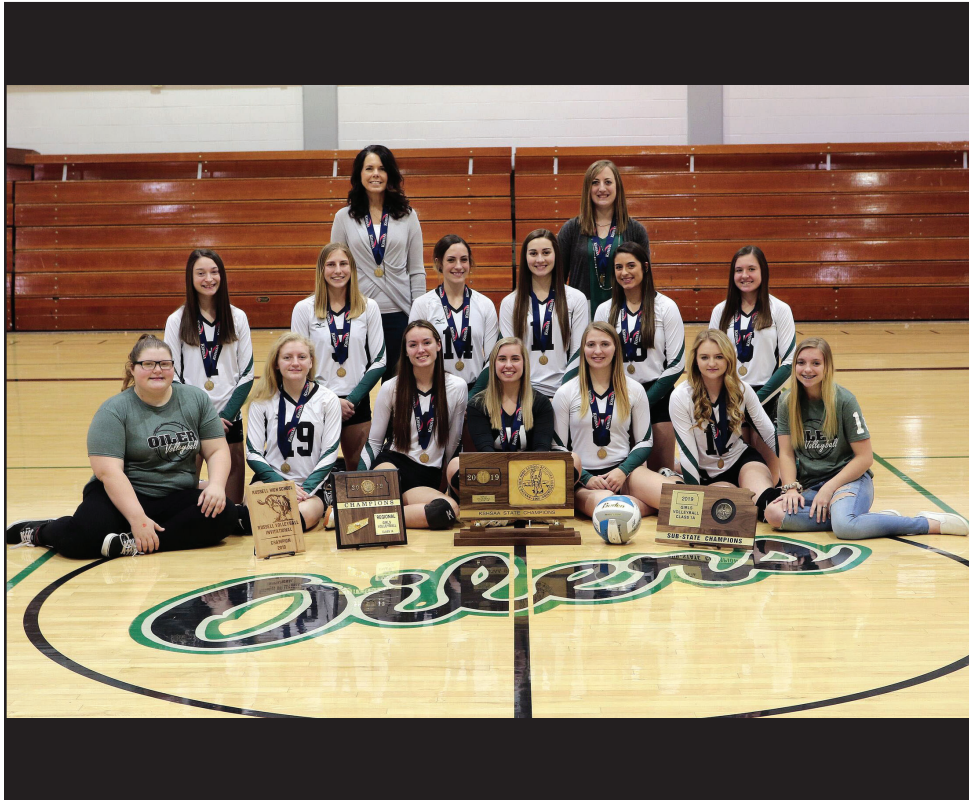

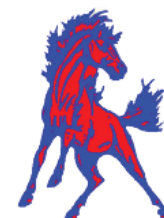

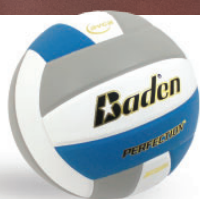
