SYNOPSIS OF MAJOR CHANGES

July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018 by the Boards listed below

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

NOTE: The Board of Directors approved the following revisions. These changes are shaded and in reverse type throughout the body of the 2018-19 KSHSAA Handbook.

RULES

5-2-1, Classification of Senior High Schools (Adopted in April 2017)

Member schools voted to change classification of schools in all activities as follows: beginning in 2018-19, class 6A will have 36 schools (previously 32), class 5A 36 schools (previously 32), class 4A 36 schools (previously 64), class 3A and 2A will still have 64 schools, and class 1A will be comprised of the remaining schools.

5-2-1, Classification of Senior High Schools (Adopted in April 2017)

Member schools vote to change football classifications with regard to the number of schools in classes 4A, 3A, 2A and 1A. The vote of schools in classes 4A, 3A, 2A and 1A approved the following: beginning with the 2018-19 scheduling cycle, football class 4A will have 32 schools (previously 64) with no divisions, class 3A will have 48 schools (previously 64), class 2A will have 48 schools, and a new class 1A will be recreated. (See Rule 35-2-3 changes below)

9-1-5, Moratoriums

Added a new section to create a summer moratorium week effective in 2019 and renamed the Winter Break Moratorium.

10-1-6, Qualifications of Coaches

Updated language to include the Sunday of SCW #3 for coaches to be able to coach athletes of their school squad.

20-1-1(a), Awards

Increased discretionary dollar amount schools may use for additional individual awards from \$25 to \$50.

30-1-6(a), Seasons of Activities

Updated language to include the Sunday of SCW #3 for coaches to be able to coach athletes of their school squad.

30-1-6(d), Seasons of Activities

Permits use of school owned football helmets in any non-school, football activities (i.e. 7 on 7, camps, all-star games) with prior approval of the school's administration.

30-1-(8-9), Seasons of Activities

Created new language for heat acclimatization practice requirements in all fall sports

33-1-4, Basketball (Girls & Boys)

Updated language to include the Sunday of SCW #35 for no player limits on 7th and 8th grade students on non-school teams.

34-1-1(a), Cross Country

Updated language to account for new heat acclimatization practice rules in Rule 30-1-8.

35-2-3, Football (Boys) (Adopted in April 2017)

Changes to football classification for the number of schools in classes 4A, 3A, 2A and 1A were sent to schools for a vote. The vote of schools in classes 4A, 3A, 2A and 1A passed. This changed the postseason format to allow a district system for 11-man football classes 3A, 2A and 1A and both 8-man divisions only. Class 4A will no longer be placed in districts for football. (Effective with the 2018-19 and 2019-20 scheduling cycle.)

35-1-(1-5), Football (Boys)

Updated language to account for new heat acclimatization practice rules in Rule 30-1-8.

36-1, Golf (Girls & Boys)

Updated language to account for new heat acclimatization practice rules in Rule 30-1-8.

37-1, Gymnastics (Girls & Boys)

Updated language to account for new heat acclimatization practice rules in Rule 30-1-8.

38-1-2, Soccer (Girls & Boys)

Updated language to account for new heat acclimatization practice rules in Rule 30-1-8.

41-1, Tennis (Girls & Boys)

Updated language to account for new heat acclimatization practice rules in Rule 30-1-8.

43-1, Volleyball (Girls)

Updated language to account for new heat acclimatization practice rules in Rule 30-1-8.

44-2-6(Note), Wrestling (Boys)

Allow schools to participate in no more than two events before 3 p.m. on any day of the week, not just Friday.

EXECUTIVE BOARD ACTIONS

Debate

- Allow the Class 3-2-1A 2-speaker Debate Championship manager and committee to schedule the tournament differently in order to better facilitate a smaller amount of teams competing.

Football

- Removed tiebreaker criteria which addresses “wins in your classification or higher” in order to address scheduling conflicts for regular season games
- Reformatted Class 1A football district and postseason structure.
- Updated language to be consistent with NFHS Rules changes of “11-man” and “8-man” to “11-player” and “8-player”

Golf

- Added language to the manual updating coaching opportunities during competition.

Speech

- Inserted language in the manual requiring interpretation and acting competitors adhere to the original language of the material they are performing.
- Added events to 4A, 3A, 2A and 1A State Speech Drama Championships.
- Increased the additional judge requirement for Speech Drama Championships in classes 5A and 6A.

Volleyball

- Changed the seeding format for 6A, 5A and 4A tournaments to allow for the same 18 team postseason bracket as used in baseball, softball, basketball and soccer.

Wrestling

- Modified weigh-in procedure for wrestlers entering regional tournaments.
- Began new method for determining order of matches in the championship finals round at state tournaments.

General

- Updated the procedure for establishing school classifications and making corrections in the event of reporting errors.
- Revised information on sports medicine topics posted on the KSHSAA website.
- Adopted heat acclimatization recommendations for marching band and spirit activities.
- Developed with the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee a concussion reporting initiative.
- Approved membership for the Classical School of Wichita, beginning in 2018-19.
