



HEATHER ARNETT, FRONTENAC

Arnett led Frontenac to 29-8 season with her all-around performance last year. The senior outside hitter led the team in kills with 331, aces with 47, digs with 298. She even finished top three in total blocks at 21. Arnett earned a spot on the CNC All-League first team as a unanimous selection.

JAYLYNE BELL, GARDNER-EDGERTON

Bell will take on the tall task of trying to help Gardner-Edgerton improve from their 15-7 record last year despite losing the Sunflower League Player of the Year Kendra Wait to graduation. Bell already led the Trailblazers in kills with 275, tied for first in aces with 19 and second in digs with 223. The 6-foot-1 senior will see if she can find her way onto an all-state team after earning Sunflower All-League first team in 2020.

MORGAN COLANGELO, BLUE VALLEY WEST

Colangelo returns for her senior season along with many of the pieces of Blue Valley West's Class 6A state title team from a season ago. The 5-foot-5 defensive specialist led the Jaguars in digs with 331 and racked up 102 assists to finish second behind only the team's setter, now graduated Alyssa Miller. Colangelo also led the team in aces at 27, which was one ahead of fellow senior Jordyn Anderson.

ANNA DEAN, LABETTE COUNTY

Dean returns for her senior season at Labette County after helping the team achieve a Southeast Kansas League championship and a 3A Sub-State Championship. The 6-foot outside hitter led the team with 272 kills, 40 aces, 62 total blocks and 322 digs. Dean was named as unanimous selection for the SEK All-League first team.

JASMINE DULAN, BLUE VALLEY NORTH

Dulan returns for her senior season with plans to get Blue Valley North to improve upon its 15-13 record from last season. The 5-foot-8 senior outside hitter led the team in kills with 246, third in digs with 222 and fifth in aces with 18. She earned EKL All-League first team and Class 6A All-State honorable mention in 2020.

AUBREY DUNCAN, FREE STATE

Duncan's play alongside fellow juniors Sawyer Thomsen and Rylee Unruh were a big reason why the Firebirds were able to turn an 18-14 season into a 6A Sub-State Championship. The 6-foot right back led the team in kills with 250, was second in total blocks with 49 and fourth in aces with 32. Duncan will see if she can join Thomsen and Unruh as all-state selections after getting a Sunflower All-League spot in 2020.

KIRSTEN EVANS, OTTAWA

Evan provided Ottawa with versatility during the team's 25-17 season that culminated in a third-place finish at state in Class 4A. The 5-foot-8 senior setter returns from a season where she posted 1010 assists, averaging 9.5 per set. Evan also had 100 kills, 36 aces, 44 blocks and 316 digs, putting her in the top five on her team in all those categories. She earned Class 4A All-State second team honors and Frontier All-League honorable mention as a junior.

Frakes returns for her senior season ready to help the Broncos build off a 24-6 season and go further in the postseason. The 6-foot-2 senior middle hitter led the team with 50 total blocks while her 153 kills ranked third. Frakes earned Frontier All-League second team honors.

ALAYCIA HARRIS, PITTSBURG

Harris returns to court hoping to lead the Dragons to a winning season after they went 8-15 last year under first-year head coach Ashlen Riggs. The junior middle hitter was a SEK All-League first team selection. She'll play next to another all-league middle hitter in senior Maddie Narges.

JULIA HEADLEY, OLATHE NORTHWEST

Headley makes two of the three-Raven trio in the Class of 2024 to make this list. The 6-foot-2 sophomore middle blocker finished first on the team in total blocks with 40, third in kills with 211 and fourth in aces with 39. Sophomores Skyler Pierce and Jillian Huckabey also finished top five in those categories. Headley landed on the Class 6A All-State second team in 2020 along with Huckabey.

DANIELLE HOWARD, UNIONTOWN

Howard helped Uniontown go 11-3 with a 7-1 record in the Three Rivers League last season. Howard earned an all-league first team spot as a unanimous selection.

RAVEYN KEGLER, FORT SCOTT

Sophomore Raveyn Kegler will look to transition to a new team after being a unanimous selection for the Three Rivers All-League first team as a Marmaton Valley Wildcat. Lucky for Kegler, her coach followed her to Fort Scott. Her mother Terra Kegler became the head coach of the Tigers after nine years running the Marmaton program.

AVA MARTIN, ST. THOMAS AQUINAS

Martin helped lead St. Thomas Aquinas to a 29-2 record and a second straight Class 5A state championship in 2020. The 6-foot senior outside hitter led the Saints in kills with 333 while also finishing third on the team in aces with 26. Martin earned All-State and EKL All-League honors as a first-team selection.

CORINNA MCMULLEN, LOUISBURG

McMullen had her hand in a large share of the points scored by Louisburg last year, a team that finished 21-10 record. The 5-foot-6 senior setter not only led the team with 439 assists, but she also led the team in kills with 207. McMullen also finished second on the team in aces with 48, third on the team in digs with 149 and even added in 20 blocks. She has earned Frontier All-League honors the last three seasons and made Class 4A All-State twice after earning a second-team spot as a junior.

BRYLEE PETERSON, MILL VALLEY

Peterson is one of five seniors returning for a Mill Valley team that went 22-7 last year. The 5-foot-11 senior outside hitter led the team with 236 kills and tied for fourth in blocks with 19 while also picking up 71 digs. Peterson earned a spot on the Sunflower All-League second team in 2020.

SKYLER PIERCE, OLATHE NORTHWEST

Pierce helped lead Olathe Northwest to a 29-3 season and a Class 6A state runner-up finish. As a freshman, the 6-foot-1 outside hitter led the Ravens in kills with 384 and aces with 48. She also tied fellow freshman Julia Headley for most solo blocks at 17. Pierce made first team for Class 6A All-State and Sunflower All-League, the only freshman to make either the list.

TAYLOR STOCKMAN, BLUE VALLEY WEST

Led the team with 286 kills as a junior. The outside hitter had a .265 hit percentage, which was second on the team behind now graduated Makenna Holand. Stockman had the fourth most blocks and most from a returning player at 48, with 42 coming as assisted blocks. She earned a spot on the Class 6A All-State first team in 2020 alongside fellow senior Morgan Colangelo.

AVA TESTRAKE, OLATHE WEST

TeStrake will try to get Olathe West to a winning season despite losing two key seniors from an 11-13 campaign last season. The junior hitter finished second on the team in kills with 156 and aces with 20, behind only outgoing senior Madalyn Ehlers in those categories. TeStrake did beat Ehlers in one category, recording one in total blocks to be fourth on the team at 22. The other key outgoing senior, Lexie Burke, was first in blocks and third in kills. TeStrake earned Sunflower All-League first team honors last season.

JACY THOMASSON, RIVERTON

Thomasson has led her teams in kills each of the past two seasons, but she really took over the scoring for Riverton during its 29-9-1 season and 3A Sub-State Championship. The 5-foot-10 junior middle hitter accounted for 517 of the team's 952 kills last season. Thomasson earned 74 total blocks, which is actually a decline from her total of 91 as a freshman. She earned 3A All-State honorable mention and was a unanimous selection for CNC All-League first team.

SAWYER THOMSEN, FREE STATE

Thomsen is one of two Firebirds to receive all-state and all-league honors in 2020, but is the only Firebird to earn both. The 6-foot-2 junior middle hitter made first All-State second team and Sunflower All-League first team. She finished first on the team in total blocks with 51 and tied for the team lead in ace at 52 with Rylee Unruh, the other Firebird to receive an all-state selection as sophomore by receiving honorable mention. Thomsen also finished 2nd kills with 250, behind only fellow all-league first teamer in junior Aubrey Duncan.
