

April 2025 Shot Clock Survey Results

- 72% response rate from member high schools
- 71.5 % want the shot clock in the postseason in the next four years
- 28.6% never want the shot clock in the postseason
 - 56.9% of the schools who responded ‘Never’ cited cost as the main reason
- 49% want the shot clock in the postseason next season
- In classes 4A-6A
 - 3% never want the shot clock in the postseason
 - 89% want the shot clock in the postseason next season
