Tennis players and coaches are always to follow tennis etiquette. Please show consideration for all players and the tennis facility which you are using. The KSHSAA follows USTA guidelines/policies regarding sportsmanship.

Sportsmanship is the foundation of tennis. It is essential to tennis as a welcoming, open, and inclusive sport. Sports integrity follows a boundless set of core values and attributes that enrich the lives of all who participate.

Sportsmanship Emphasis for Week 4: GRUNTING

From the USTA 'Friend at Court 2025': A player should avoid grunting and making other loud noises. Grunting and other loud noises may bother not only opponents but also players on adjacent courts. In an extreme case, an opponent or a player on an adjacent court may seek the assistance of an official. KSHSAA Addition: If an official is not present, players may ask their coach to speak with the tournament director.

TIME ISSUES

See page 25 in the KSHSAA Tennis Manual to review time issues. These must be regulated throughout the regular season by coaches and tournament administrators. Time will be regulated at the State Tennis Tournament by the State Tournament Official – start good practices now.

ALL PLAY IS CONTINUOUS

- a. Between points 20 seconds max (players only)
- b. Changing ends 90 seconds max
- c. End of a set 2 minutes max
- d. Split sets 10 minutes max (or shorter if both players agree)
- e. Before tiebreak 90 seconds max (6-all or 8-all pro set; coaching is allowed before tiebreak)
- f. Before Super Tiebreak 3 minutes max

STUDENT MANAGER GUIDELINES

School tennis players who serve as team managers during the opposite tennis season must confine their duties to traditional managerial tasks (i.e. keeping stats, organizing equipment, pro- and post-practice match duties). THEY MAY NOT HIT (PLAY) IN PRACTICE.
