NEW - KSHSAA INTERPRETATION OF MASKING POLICY

At the 4/30/21 KSHSAA Board of Directors Meeting, the following language was approved:

The requirement for wearing a face covering terminates on May 1, 2021 for all outdoor activities. The mask mandates for indoor activities will end at the end of the spring championships. Schools shall continue to adhere to all local risk mitigation policies.

IMPORTANT – Any local risk mitigation policies in place will be followed. In that case, the following may be used.

KSHSAA INTERPRETATION OF MASKING POLICY

KSHSAA Executive Board interpretation March 23, 2021: Any participant (including but not limited to athletes, coaches, officials, spectators, support staff and all others attending/participating in **school activities outdoors**, who is able to maintain a minimum of six feet of social distancing would not be required to wear a face covering.

MASKING FOR BOY'S POSTSEASON TENNIS:

1. **COACHES:** must wear a mask when talking to their players on a 90 second changeover, when they meet with their players who split sets (10 minutes), when there is an injury timeout or any other unforeseen situation where social distancing cannot be practiced.
2. **ATHLETES:** May but are not required to wear a mask when playing. Athletes must wear a mask when sitting with their teammates between matches or other times when not able to social distance from others.
3. **SPECTATORS:** are required to wear a mask when not able to social distance. For family units (those living under the same roof) attending events as spectators, may sit together and be unmasked if they are able to maintain social distance from other patrons.
4. **EVENTMANAGEMENT:** Event management, /score keeper must wear a mask when players report results of a match.

NOTE: When masks are worn, they must be worn as intended (i.e., covering the nose and mouth).
