The Executive Board of the Kansas State High School Activities Association met in on Wednesday and Thursday, January 11-12, 2023, with the following in attendance: President Roger Perkins, David Abel, Justin Briggs, Deena Horst, Mike Kastle, Ben Mitchell, Delvin Strecker, Tammie Romstad, Justin Seuser, Sean Spoons, Drew Thon, Paul Zuzelski and Bill Faflick, Executive Director. Assistant Executive Directors Francine Martin, Mark Lentz, Jeremy Holaday, Craig Manteuffel, Rod Garman, Annie Diederich, Kyle Doperalski and Director of Operations Brent Unruh were also present. Board member Deena Horst was absent Wednesday due to the State Board of Education meetings.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

The following items were all approved unanimously via consent:

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS AND UPDATES

The Board received reports from Executive Director Bill Faflick, and the Assistant Executive Directors regarding the status of programs and services of the Association. The Executive Director gave a financial report and an update on the business of the National Federation of State High School Associations following the recent NFHS Winter meeting, as well as an update on the business of National Interscholastic Administrators Association following their annual conference.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND APPEAL BOARD ELECTION REMINDER

Member schools are reminded of upcoming elections for positions on the KSHSAA Board of Directors and Appeal Board. An email was sent on January 17th providing information on positions for members of local boards of education and junior high/middle and senior high school administrators. *Individuals interested in being candidates for these positions must submit their names to the KSHSAA by February 15.* Please see **Bylaws IV and VII** in the Handbook for the required procedures to submit candidate names. The spring issue of the *Activities Journal* will contain a special section with this information.

Senior high school principals should note information reminding them to identify their league affiliation and league representatives to the KSHSAA Board of Directors for 2023-2024 was sent to them via email on January 17th.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS APRIL AGENDA DEADLINE REMINDER

Per **Amendments Bylaw, Article XVI** in the KSHSAA Handbook, member schools are reminded **Monday, March 20, 2023**, is the deadline for member schools to propose KSHSAA Handbook rule changes for consideration by the Board of Directors at their next meeting, April 27, 2023.

KSHSAA HALL OF FAME – CLASS OF 2022

The Executive Board received a report following the selection meeting for the 2022 KSHSAA Hall of Fame Committee. Five individuals were selected from 25 qualified nominees. Those selected are coach Kenneth Brown, Independence; administrator David Cherry, Buhler; coach Patricia Grzenda, Lawrence; student Bo Maynes, Norman, Oklahoma; and coach Douglas Vander Linden, Burlington (posthumously). Respective induction ceremonies are being scheduled in conjunction to honorees wishes. More information on these individuals is available at the Gallery of Champions at www.khsaachamps.org.

FALL ACTIVITY POSTSEASON UPDATES

Staff provided the Board with a recap of championships concluded since their last meeting. Events discussed included:

- a. **Unified Bowling Championships** – Staff were directed to continue reaching out to local education cooperatives across the state as a way of communicating availability of the activity to more students with special needs. Age limitations of participants were also discussed along with the seasons of sport requirements of a new activity.

- b. **Game Day Spirit Showcase – Dance and Cheer** – The discussion reflected positive changes to Varsity Spirit tabulation process, increased participation of member schools, challenges and upcoming changes for the Topeka Stormont Vail Event Center, and a proposal for the Board of Directors requesting the use of football classifications to be used for both the cheer and dance showcases instead of general classifications.
- c. **Football Championships** – No contracts for state sites have been made for the 2023 season yet, so discussion was held on the locations and dates of the state championship games. Staff was asked to bring a proposal(s) to the next Executive Board meeting showing what a state football championship day with two or more games conducted at one site might involve, including but not limited to timelines and staffing needs, and what a championship day may look like with staggering start times at locations when following the current format of one game at each site.

HANDBOOK RULE REVIEW

Discussion was held relative to **Rule 14 - Bona Fide Student** and the terminology therein describing a “student in good standing”. The Board was asked about student representation of member schools during KSHSAA events and school hours versus non-school hours. It was stressed member schools should develop, adopt and follow their own codes of conduct and local school/district policies when determining good standing and should only ask for Association determination for unusual circumstances.

SPORTSMANSHIP

Following incidents at member school basketball games, staff facilitated a conversation with Executive Board members on sportsmanship violations. Updates were given on the situations and discussion was held regarding support extended by the Association to schools during their regular season games. Additionally, discussion was held on training given to officials as they encounter and navigate inappropriate sportsmanship from spectators. The current protocol details officials are to notify school administrators to address crowd control rather than directly confronting fans. When administration is not present, the head coach would be the individual responsible for their fans.

MIDDLE SCHOOL LEAGUE ASSIGNMENT HEARING

Based on the action of the Executive Board at their November 2022 meeting, Superintendent Renee Nugent, Principal Chad Bilderback and Athletic Director Tyler Lueckenhoff from Atchison Middle School appeared before the Executive Board seeking a league assignment for their school per **Bylaw ARTICLE XV, League Affiliation**. The Board granted this hearing based on repeated unsuccessful efforts by Atchison Middle School to secure league affiliation during the last few years.

Following a presentation by the school, administrative representatives of the Big 7 Junior League and Kaw Valley Junior League presented information regarding the status of their leagues and their position on the potential assignment of a new member school. The following administrators appeared on behalf of their respective leagues:

Big 7 Junior League – Athletic Director Brandon Giltner, Holton Middle School; Athletic Director David Schooler, Mayetta-Royal Valley Middle School; Principal Michael Kimberlin, Holton Middle School; Athletic Director Matt Stapp, Meriden-Jefferson West Middle School; Athletic Director Jessica Koch, Seneca-Nemaha Central Middle School.

Kaw Valley Junior League – Principal Bill Weber, Kansas City-Turner Middle School; Principal Clark McCracken, DeSoto-Lexington Trails Middle School; District Administrator Ryan Holsten, Gardner-Edgerton USD 231; Principal Steve Mercer, Kansas City-Piper Middle School; District Administrator Brian Schwanz, DeSoto USD 232; Principal Jennifer Smith, Shawnee-Monticello Trails Middle School; Principal Andy Legler, Lenexa-Mill Creek Middle School.

Following presentations and discussion, a motion was made to assign Atchison Middle School to a league beginning in the 2023-24 school year. Following an amendment to the motion the Executive Board approved assigning Atchison Middle School to the Big 7 Junior League beginning with the 2024-25 school year.

All parties were reminded in accordance with **KSHSAA Bylaw ARTICLE XV, League Affiliation**, schools are not permitted to withdraw from a league to which a school has been assigned for a period of three years without a unanimous vote by all member schools of the league including the newly assigned member school. All schools were reminded existing game contracts shall be honored as they proceed to incorporate the newly assigned schools into their respective leagues.

TEAM ACTIVITY JAMBOREES

As part of the continued follow up from the October Regional meetings, the Executive Board asked staff to provide a draft of the format for possible Jamborees for all team activities. Staff led the Board in a discussion regarding the proposed format for the activities of Soccer, Volleyball, Basketball, Baseball, and Softball. When presenting each activity, staff asked for feedback from the Board on the format and any challenges that may come up. The Board directed staff to adjust each of the activity proposals and bring them back for further consideration at the March meeting.

ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATION

A transfer determination request was brought to the Executive Board regarding the eligibility status of a student. The student transferred schools in mid-November and a Hardship Exception form T-E/H was originally filed. When it was determined by the former school and KSHSAA staff the reason for the transfer did not meet hardship standards and was denied, a T-E/P, partial eligibility form was submitted and approved for the student to be able to participate in non-varsity basketball at the new school. While the student has been participating at this level since the early December determination, it was the request of the family to appeal against the hardship determination made by the Executive Director. Following discussion and a review of all material submitted, the Board voted to uphold the decision. The student remains eligible as a non-varsity participant in activities rostered in the previous 12 months prior to transfer, including basketball, until the student completes the transfer period of one calendar year at the new school.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO PPE

At their fall 2022 meeting, the KSHSAA Sports Medicine Advisory Team reviewed changes made during the previous legislative session to expand the authority of nurse practitioners in the state of Kansas. It was determined changes should be made to amend KSHSAA **Rule 7 Physical Examination Parental Consent** allowing for consistency with recently adopted legislation. Following discussion, the Executive Board approved sending the following language to the KSHSAA Board of Directors for final approval:

Rule 7 - Physical Examination Parental Consent

Section I: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: No student is eligible to represent any school in interschool athletics, spirit or spirit competition groups until there is on file with the superintendent or principal, a statement certifying that the student has passed an adequate physical examination and is physically fit to participate in interschool athletics, spirit or spirit competition groups. The statement must be signed by any of the following licensed health care providers: (i) a physician; (ii) a chiropractor; (iii) a physician assistant (PA) who has been authorized to perform this examination by a Kansas licensed supervising physician; or (iv) an advance practice registered nurse (APRN) who has been authorized to perform this examination by a Kansas licensed supervising physician. This statement shall also be signed by a parent or legal guardian, stating the student has permission to participate.

FALL PRACTICE REQUIREMENTS

KSHSAA staff have received communications from some member schools seeking relief from certain components of the fall practice requirements. Specifically, member schools who begin activities on a later start date than the traditional first day of high school practice (Monday of SCW #7), particularly at the middle school level, suggested a modification would be appropriate. Following a discussion regarding the practice requirements of fall sports that were changed during the 2021-22 school year, the Executive Board members were given proposed rule changes, also reviewed and supported by the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee. The proposed rule changes for the activities of cross country, football, and soccer may allow for a reduction (not elimination) of the practice requirement for member schools who begin practice after the Monday of SCW #13 prior to the first competition. The Executive Board adjusted the proposed changes and requested a final review by the SMAC before the next Board meeting.

MUSIC RULE AMENDMENTS APPROVED FOR BOD ACTION

Executive Board members discussed the agenda for the next Board of Directors meeting. Items were introduced by staff for possible addition to the agenda. Following discussion, these items were approved to be added to the Thursday, April 27, 2023, Board of Directors meeting agenda:

1. **Modify Rule 5 – Classification of Senior High Schools, Section 2, Article 1** as follows:

NEW addition at the end of 5-2-1

Spirit Competition Groups Exception: Classifications for the purpose of creating Spirit Competition Group assignments shall be based on the total enrollment in the school's ninth, tenth, and eleventh grades as submitted to the KSHSAA on the date established by state statute for official enrollment. Assignments will be made biennially for the two school years following the enrollment calculation. The enrollment count shall parallel the football cycle with enrollment tabulations conducted in odd numbered years.

2. **Modify Rule 5 – Classification of Senior High Schools, Section 2, Article 1** as follows:

NEW addition at the end of 5-2-1

Music Exception: Classifications for the purpose of creating Music assignments shall be based on the total enrollment in the school's ninth, tenth, eleventh, and twelfth grades as submitted to the KSHSAA on the date established by state statute for official enrollment. Due to facility size for State Solos and Small Ensembles all music classification assignments will be made according to the following, Class 6A shall include the thirty-two (32) high schools with the largest enrollments; Class 5A the next thirty-two (32); 4A the next fifty-six (56); 3A the next sixty-four (64); 2A the next sixty-four (64); and Class 1A, the remainder.

DISCUSSION ON BACKGROUND CHECKS FOR OFFICIALS

The Executive Board was given a review on the current process utilized for background checks of registered officials. Additionally, staff discussed correspondence received from NFHS partners that would provide a more formal system of background checks and anticipated cost if the Association determined to utilize such a system. The Board determined current practices were sufficient but asked staff to keep them informed of new procedures should they need to be implemented. A follow up discussion and possible action item will be considered at the March Executive Board meeting.

VOLLEYBALL UPDATES

Assistant Executive Director Annie Diederich led a discussion with the Executive Board on recommended changes to the 2023-24 Volleyball Manual. While rule changes may need to be determined at a future meeting, the Board unanimously approved the following updates:

1. Blue shirts are required for officials to wear at varsity and postseason contests beginning in the fall of 2023.
2. Officials may wear blue or white for sub-varsity contests, but the officials must match on each court.
3. Schools must recommend a minimum of 7 officials and a maximum of 12 officials for postseason consideration using a two-year window of observation for selection.
4. During the regular season the home team will select their bench for the first set. Teams will switch benches after the first set. Before the third set the team that wins the coin toss can pick side or serve.
5. At state tournaments, the home team (higher seed) gets to pick their bench for the match. Teams will not switch sides because there is no distinct disadvantage at any of the state venues. By remaining on the same bench, it will help to have crowds remain in the same location in support of their respective teams.

TENNIS MANUAL UPDATES

Assistant Executive Director Annie Diederich presented the Executive Board with proposed changes to the KSHSAA Tennis Manual. The proposals would bring Association practices in line with updates made to the United States Tennis Association (USTA) rules during the past year. Since the NFHS does not have playing rules for tennis, the KSHSAA follows USTA rules for competition. Following discussion, the Board approved the following changes:

ONLY ONE COACH MAY APPROACH THE FENCE TO COACH.

Coaches and spectators are not allowed to coach at any other time. Verbal instructions/codes and discreet visual signals directed to players during a game are prohibited.

Play should be continuous; from the time the match starts (when the first serve of the match is put in play) until the match finishes.

- a. Between points = maximum of 20 seconds is allowed
- b. When players change ends at the end of a game = maximum of 90 seconds allowed.
- c. Coaching may take place after the first game of each set (maximum = 90 seconds from end of game to first serve of next game). The time limit is to be strictly followed/enforced.
- d. At the end of each set = set break of 120 seconds maximum
- e. Split sets = 10-minute rest maximum
- f. Before tiebreak = 90 seconds max (6-all or 8-all pro set) (Coaching is allowed before tiebreak)
- g. Before Super Tiebreak = ~~2 minutes~~ 3 minutes (USTA Friend at Court 2022 Handbook of Rules and Regulations, page 96, Table 12-Time Allowed Between Sets – Juniors, Boys' & Girls' 12-16, 18; "After 2nd set when Match Tiebreak is played in lieu of 3rd set – Mandatory 3-minute rest period)

Tournament managers, coaches and players should be reminded of the following:

1. NEVER leave a tournament site without knowing the time schedule and plan for future matches that day. Players should remain at the tournament site throughout the day as it is difficult to pinpoint the exact time they will play. Players should anticipate when they will play, report early and always be within hearing distance.
2. WARM-UP prior to a match is 10 minutes unless players agree to start earlier.
3. ALL PLAY IS CONTINUOUS
 - a. Between points = 20 seconds max
 - b. Changing ends = 90 seconds max
 - c. End of a set = 2 minutes max
 - d. Split sets = 10 minutes max (shorter if players agree)

- e. Before tiebreak = 90 seconds max (6-all or 8-all pro set) (Coaching is allowed before tiebreak)
- f. Before Super = ~~2 minutes max Tiebreak~~ 3 minutes (USTA Friend at Court 2022 Handbook of Rules and Regulations, page 96, Table 12-Time Allowed Between Sets – Juniors, Boys' & Girls' 12-16, 18; "After 2n set when Match Tiebreak is played in lieu of 3rd set – Mandatory 3-minute rest period)

General Procedure

Regional: All matches will be the best 2 out of 3 sets (tiebreak on 6-all). Exception: Play-in matches (matches to qualify for the bracket of 16 players) will be ~~9 game pro sets~~ 8 game pro set (tiebreak at 8-all). Matches M,N,O,P,Q,R,S will play out the 3rd set, if needed; all other matches will use the 10 point super tiebreak.

State: All first round and front side matches will be the best 2 out of 3 sets (tiebreak at 6-all); matches on the back side will be ~~9 game pro sets~~ 8 game pro set (tiebreak at 8-all); matches I, J, K, L, M,N, 3rd place and championship will play out the 3rd set, if needed; all other front side matches going to a 3rd set will use the 10 point super tiebreak.

(USTA Friend at Court 2022 Handbook of Rules and Regulations, page 51, Part 3, 1-E-4; Pro sets. A match may consist of a pro set. Unless otherwise specified, a pro set is one set in which a player or team must win 8 games by a margin of two games to win the match.)

ADMINISTRATOR RULES MEETING REQUIREMENT

Executive Director Bill Faflick requested the Executive Board once again require a mandatory rule meeting for administrators at all member school. Meetings held in-person during the fall of 2022 ran concurrently with administrator seminars across the state and included a makeup meeting online for those unable to attend. Following discussion, the Board voted unanimously to continue with this setup and require at least one administrator (principal or athletic director) from every member school attend a rule meeting yearly. The meetings to be held in late July and early August 2023 will again cover **Rule 18 Transfer**. Time was extended to 1.5 hours and will include information on new or updated rules for the 2023-24 school year.

OFFICIATING FEES

On an annual basis, the Association reviews officiating fees in a planned three-year rotation of all sports. KSHSAA staff provided the Executive Board with information on postseason officiating fees in the activities of Soccer, Swimming & Diving, Track & Field, and Area Supervisors. Staff provided the Board with an analysis of the fiscal impact if fees were to be increased. In this year, due to significant rate changes during the pandemic at member schools and limited movement in KSHSAA rates, the Executive Board will review activities in all fees. Following preliminary analysis, the Board referred this item to the agenda of their March meeting for final consideration.

KIAAA CLASSIFICATION FORUM

The Executive Board reviewed an opportunity to submit items to the KIAAA Classification Forum which is part of the annual KIAAA Conference each spring. The conference will be in Mulvane at the Kansas Star Event Center. Mark Lentz will serve as the staff liaison to the KIAAA Board of Directors following the retirement of Francine Martin in June.

KSHSAA COVERED TRUE BLUE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

At their previous meeting, the Board directed staff to update the requirements for the KSHSAA Covered True Blue Scholarship Program to eliminate financial need as a requirement for application. Staff provided an overview of the updates and application process. Student applications will open by January 20 and will close on March 1, 2023.

INTERPRETATION DISCUSSION

Based upon inquiries from member schools and patrons regarding the existing interpretation of 2022 legislative session enacted House Bill 2511, the Executive Board was asked to review staff and legal counsel approved interpretation relative to the intersection with KSHSAA eligibility rules. This directive impacted member schools by allowing students to transfer to/from another school per the student's choice and would allow for students to dually enroll in the local school and an online school of their choice. The current interpretation does not provide eligibility in KSHSAA governed activities solely on dual enrollment in a KSHSAA member school and any other school. As per previous interpretation, dual enrollment is provided only when member school attendance is in conjunction with a postsecondary institution or a KSDE accredited virtual school. Following discussion, the Executive Board confirmed current interpretation for students wishing to participate in KSHSAA activities.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Following the passage of a private school multiplier and classification updates amongst both KSHSAA members schools and the Kansas State Board of Education during 2022, staff members have been working with Kansas legislators on preparing changes to state statutes that would allow for the KSHSAA to update classifications based on other factors in addition to school enrollment numbers. With the legislative session beginning the same week as this KSHSAA Executive Board meeting, staff and Board members received an update on the status of legislative bills that have been or will be introduced this year that affect the KSHSAA member schools. These bills included:

1. **House Bill 2003** – Authorizing the Kansas state high school activities association to establish a school classification system based on student attendance and other factors.
2. **Senate Bill 13** – Permitting certain local broadcasters to provide broadcast services of a school's postseason activities notwithstanding if the state high school activities association enters into an exclusive broadcast agreement for post-season activities.
3. **Not yet introduced House Bill** – possibly reintroducing concussion legislation similar to last year Requiring schools to establish policies and concussion management teams to prevent and manage concussions within school.
4. **Not yet introduced Senate Bill** – Authorizing the Kansas state high school activities association to establish a school classification system based on student attendance and other factors.

BASKETBALL SUBVARSITY GAME TIME CLARIFICATION

Staff were notified of some member schools playing sub-varsity basketball games utilizing three, 7-minute-long quarters. The Board reviewed NFHS playing rules and KSHSAA exceptions to determine the validity of this practice. It was determined schools who play 7-minute quarters are in violation of current basketball playing rules. Current exceptions allow for two, 8-minute quarters or four, 4-minute quarters to be played on the same night as a varsity contest and not affect a player's eligibility for four quarters of varsity play. Current NFHS rules require quarters to be 8-minute length in time and therefore 7-minute quarters are not permissible.

FRANCINE MARTIN ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT

The Executive Board reluctantly accepted official notice from Assistant Executive Director Francine Martin of her plans to retire effective July 1, 2023. The Executive Board went on record thanking Ms. Martin for her exemplary work, dedication and service to the member schools of the KSHSAA as well as the youth of Kansas. During the 2022-23 school year, Martin transitioned into a new responsibility developing an Officials Administrator position. Martin will continue in this role until her last day with the Association on June 30, 2023.
