 9. On Tuesday, March 31 at 4:30 p.m., Jan Mason of Willis Towers Watson Insurance will make the annual presentation regarding the KSHSAA Liability/Catastrophe Insurance program. A decision to purchase coverage required of all member schools for 2020-21 shall be discussed and determined. Note: This year's premium was \$6.61 per participant and the current proposal will increase to \$6.97. (Action)

It is recommended that the proposal for one-year catastrophic coverage be approved at \$6.97 per student participating in athletic activities.

 10. Blue Valley Dual Degree Program – Blue Valley USD 229 is implementing an early college program for students staring next year. The program provides 100% instruction on the college campus for both junior and senior years. Successful completion of the program results in a High School diploma and an Associate Degree. USD 229 is seeking relief/clarification of Rule 13-1-3(b) - Scholarship Requirements which states in part:

NOTE: High school students dually enrolled in colleges, who have their college hours recorded on their high school transcript, may count five hours of college credit as two subjects of unit weight or three hours of college credit as one subject of unit weight. However, the student must attend at least one class of unit weight at the member, base school per semester.

- REVISED: 2020-21 Membership Dues Approve KSHSAA membership dues for 2020-2021 per Bylaw Article IX, Dues. (Action) *Note – Current dues are \$400 High School and \$125 Jr. High/Middle School. Dues last increased in 1988.

It is recommended that membership fees be approved at \$500/HS and \$200/MS/JH

12. **PPE Form Updates** - Based upon release of the fifth monograph of the Pre-Participation Physical Exam, the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee has updated the document for

use in Kansas schools for immediate adoption and implementation. - *See Support Material*– (Action)

It is recommended that the revised PPE be adopted for use by member schools.

13. Quasi-Individual Cooperative Agreements – The Executive Board has been requested to review a long-standing interpretation regarding schools entered into a cooperative agreement. The interpretation indicates schools participating in quasi-individual activities separate and represent respective schools in postseason competition. The request is to allow these schools to remain intact for postseason competition in the classification established by the combined enrollment of the schools in the cooperative agreement. –*See Support Material*– (Action)

It is recommended the existing interpretation remain intact and schools engaged in a cooperative agreement separate for postseason competition in quasi-individual sports.

- 14. **Public Private School** Staff will provide an update on initiatives and efforts to address the Public/Private school concern regarding a level playing field in the pursuit of championships. Topics to address include:

- 15. **Bona Fide Move Definition** Based upon discussion at most recent regularly scheduled meeting, the Executive Board will review finalized interpretations of a bona fide move. **(Discussion/Possible Action)**
- 16. **Transfer Hardship Definition** the Executive Board will review the adopted definition of a hardship as applied to transfer students. The board will receive examples and non-examples of transfer hardships. **(Discussion/Possible Action)**
- 17. **Transfer Rule 18-1-4** Historically, students transferring from a non-member school are approved for immediate eligibility at the new school (assuming lack of undue influence and satisfaction of all other eligibility requirements). With implementation of the new transfer ineligibility period, it is appropriate to recommend a modification to 18-1-4. (Discussion/Action)

It is recommended that students transferring from a non-member school be eligible only at the non-varsity level for the first year of attendance in all activities.

- 18. Listen/Learn League meeting follow up- The Executive Board will identify themes emerging from discussion and learning from meetings conducted with each Kansas League/Conference.
- 9th Grade Football Issue Based upon a request from a member school, consideration is requested to allow freshman football players to play "up" and play "down". Due to lack of MS/JH students, the school would like approval to allow freshman to practice and play at the high school level and to additionally be able to practice at the MS/JH level. (Discussion/Action)

It is recommended that students be either High School or MS/JH and not play or practice at both levels and that the Executive Board not support dual level participation.

20. Spirit Groups participating in Out of State competitions – The Executive Board will review current rules allowing school field trips beyond the 500-mile limit. Precedent is based upon extrapolation of *Rule 46 Music (46-1-4)* which has allowed these field trips. Discussion will focus on definition of what constitutes a class field trip versus a team trip. - See Support Material– (Discussion/Action)

It is recommended that the Executive Board approve the definition of a class and the protocol used to define a field trip as included in the attachment.

Virtual Debate Students in member schools of the KSHSAA have the opportunity to participate in virtual debate tournaments in preparation for NASSP approved debate championship competition (which may also be virtual). It is recommended the KSHSAA provide a one summer opportunity for virtual debate participation provided competition is in preparation for, or participation in, NASSP approved debate events and all COVID-19 imposed limits are maintained.
