Bylaws, XVI, amendments, state:

Section 1: The bylaws and articles of incorporation may be amended at any regular or called meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote of those present of the Board of Directors, and the approval of the Kansas State Board of Education.

Section 2: KSHSAA Board of Directors' agenda items must be presented in writing to the Association Executive Director 40 days in advance of the September and April meetings. Only those items submitted by the following will be recognized:

- 1. Board of Directors members
- 2. Executive Board, provided the item received a majority vote of those present
- 3. Superintendents, principals and board of education members of member schools
- 4. The Board of Directors may add items which were not previously published on the agenda at the time of the meeting, provided it is done by three-fourths vote of those present.

On page 26 of the KSHSAA Handbook, under **Rules and Regulations Governing Grades 7-12**, the first paragraph concerning AMENDMENTS reads as follows:

The rules and regulations for grades seven through twelve (grade school, middle school, junior high and senior high) may be amended at any regular or called meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote of those present.

In the 1981 legislative session, the following, which applies to unified school districts, was passed:

Any member who abstains from voting shall be counted as having voted against the motion or resolution. If a member announces a conflict of interest with regard to the issue, the member may leave the meeting until the voting on the issue is concluded, and the member who abstains from voting thereby shall not be counted as having voted. K.S.A. 72-1138.

- 1. Each Handbook rule is divided into three or four sections:
 - **Section 1: General Regulations** (apply to grades 7-12)
 - **Section 2: Senior High Regulations**
 - Section 3: Middle/Junior High School Regulations (includes students in grades 7 and 8, middle school and junior high)
 - **Section 4: Unified Activity Regulations** (apply to grades 9-12)
- Unless stated otherwise, articles passed by a majority of the members present will become effective upon publication of the minutes.

- 5. **Public Forum** Speakers must register by 2:55 p.m. on the day of the meeting and identify which agenda item they will address with remarks. Public comments are limited to 3 minutes per speaker.

Public comments are also accepted via email in advance of the meeting. Comments should be sent to bfaflick@kshsaa.org prior to noon, April 24, 2025, with subject line of "Board of Director Public Forum Comments". Public comments received in digital format will be shared with Board members and referenced in the meeting. (Comments shall not reference/identify personnel matters concerning Association or school employees and/or matters that would violate the privacy of students.) When providing comments in person or via email, complete contact information (first/last name, city/state, daytime phone number) is necessary. Incomplete information will result in the comments not being shared nor included in the minutes.

Introduction, Discussion and Vote will be held on the following action items in the order listed unless modified by presiding officer: (Unless otherwise indicated, underlined portions are recommended changes in rules.)

- 6. Approve September 18, 2024, Minutes.
- 7. Temporarily Suspend Section 3 of Bylaw XIV Approval of Events which indicates the following:

Any contest or activity under the jurisdiction of the KSHSAA sponsored by an outside agency which is on the approved list of the National Association of Secondary School Principals shall be considered automatically approved.

The NASSP has discontinued the service of approving events. At this time, no other agency or process has been identified to provide this service. The Executive Board recommends the Board of Directors temporarily suspend **Bylaw XIV, Section 3,** and utilize the roster of all events historically approved by the NASSP and attended by KSHSAA member schools to be approved for the next school year.

Created and approved for Board of Directors Agenda inclusion by the KSHSAA Executive Board (January 12-13, 2025).

- 8. Modify Rule 30, Seasons of Activities, Section 1, Article 9 to read:
 - **Art. 9:** Beginning Monday of SCW #7, the following practice rules apply to football, boys and girls cross country, fall season soccer, girls volleyball, girls gymnastics, fall season tennis and fall season golf. These rules apply for each student until their first interscholastic competition or Monday of SCW #9, whichever is later.
 - g. Beginning Monday of SCW #7, dual sport athletes are permitted to participate in practices for both sports on the same day, on consecutive days of the week, but combined practice time may not exceed three hours per day until the student has participated in five days of practice for each sport. After five days of practice in each sport, the student may practice up to a combined five hours per day on an every-other-day basis until their first interscholastic competition or Monday of SCW #9, whichever is later.

Created and vetted by the KSHSAA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee and approved for Board of Directors Agenda inclusion by the KSHSAA Executive Board (November 20-21, 2024).

- 9. Modify Rule 33, Basketball (Girls & Boys), Section 2, Articles 2 & 9 to read:
 - Art. 2: Competition shall not begin prior to Thursday Monday of Standardized Calendar Week #22.
 - Art. 5: No student may participate in more than 20 games, including those games played in tournaments.
 - a. Regardless of the tournament format, the maximum number of games played in a season, exclusive of KSHSAA postseason competition, shall be 20 games.
 - b. Invitational tournaments shall be limited to a maximum of eight teams (See Rule 33-1-3). EXCEPTION: In league tournaments involving nine or more teams, those teams who must play a contest to qualify for the eight-team bracket may find themselves playing four in lieu of three games in that tournament. As a result, they would be allowed 21 in lieu of 20 games during the season.
 - c. Unless otherwise approved by the Executive Board, varsity invitational <u>and league pre-season</u> tournaments shall be held:
 - (1) Early season—A league pre-season tournament involving all league member schools may be held during Standardized Calendar Week #22. Invitational varsity tournaments shall be held during Standardized Calendar Weeks #23 or #24. Standardized Calendar Week #24 is for girls' tournaments only, if not held during Standardized Calendar Week #23.
 - (2) Mid-Season—Invitational varsity tournaments shall be held during Standardized Calendar Weeks #29 or #30. Standardized Calendar Week #30 is for girls' tournaments only, if not held during the first week.
 - d. Unless otherwise approved by the Executive Board, league and/or non-varsity tournaments shall be held at least two weeks prior to the postseason tournament series.

10. Modify Rule 35, Football (Boys), Section 2, Article 3 to read:

Art. 3: The Executive Board shall arrange for a district system of playoffs for three Classes (3A, 2A and 1A) in 11-Player, as well as for two championships in 8-Player football (two divisions). Classes 6A, 5A and 4A will not be placed in districts. For 8-Player district football participation, assignments shall be limited to those schools with a maximum enrollment of 100 120 students in grades 9, 10 and 11. For 6-Player district football participation, assignments shall be limited to those schools with a maximum enrollment of 55 students in grades 9, 10 and 11.

11. Create Handbook Rule 54, Esports (Girls & Boys) and modify language of Rule 10, Qualification of Coaches, to include eSports as a KSHSAA activity as follows:

Rule 54 - Esports (Girls & Boys)

Section 1: General Regulations (apply to grades 7-12)

Art. 1: Students representing member schools in interscholastic Esports activities are required to meet the same qualifications as those representing their school in all other interscholastic activities (i.e. grades, transfer scholarship, etc.; refer to **Rules 12-19**).

Art. 2: Esport coaches shall meet the requirements of *Rule 10 – Qualifications of Coaches* (Athletic, Spirit, Scholars Bowl, Speech, and Music Directors)

- **Art. 3:** Schools are encouraged to schedule as many dual matches as possible. It is recommended these competitions begin after school hours.
- **Art. 4:** Competition may be virtual or in-person.

Section 2: Senior High Regulations (apply to grades 9-12)

- Art. 1: Practice shall not begin prior to Monday of Standardized Calendar Week #21.
- Art. 2: Competition shall begin no earlier than Monday of Standardized Calendar Week #22.
- **Art. 3:** Regionals, when needed, will be held prior to the State Tournament. Regionals will be conducted as in-person competitions.
- **Art. 4:** The state tournament shall be held during Standardized Calendar Week # 30. The state tournament will be conducted as in-person competitions.
- **Art. 5:** No student representing a member school shall participate in more than 9 days of competition for any unique game during a season, exclusive of regional and state tournaments.
- **Art. 6:** No school may participate in more than 12 days of competition for any unique game during the season, exclusive of regional and state tournaments.
- **Art. 7:** In order to be eligible for regional tournaments, a student must participate in a minimum of one competition date as an "in-person" participant.
- **Art. 8:** The Executive Board has the authority to revise the participation regulations and to establish regulations for outside tournament competitions.
- Art. 9: Competitions outside of the designated school season are considered club activities.

Section 3: Middle/Junior High School Regulations (apply to grades 7-8)

- **Art. 1:** No student representing a member school shall participate in more than eight days of competition for any unique game during a season.
- **Art. 2:** No school may participate in more than 10 days of competition for any unique game during the season.

Section 4: Unified Activity Regulations (apply to grades 9-12)

Rule 10 – Qualifications of Coaches (Athletic, <u>Esports</u>, Spirit, Scholars Bowl, Debate and Speech) and Music Directors

Created and approved for Board of Directors Agenda inclusion by the KSHSAA Executive Board (November 20-21, 2024) with language vetted by the KSHSAA esports Task Force.

12. Elect Executive Board Members from the Board of Directors per Bylaw Article V.

Sec. 2: Board of Director members shall elect Executive Board members at their spring meeting in the categories listed to two-year terms. A Director shall serve at least one year as a member of the Board of Directors prior to being elected to the Executive Board. Members in each category shall elect their own representative. Board of Directors organizational members are eligible for election in their school's respective category.


