BASIC Q/A'S

WE ALREADY DO SERVICE @ SCHOOL?

- Collecting canned goods (done by many classes/sports teams)?
- KAY service projects involve opportunity for planning, organizing, time management, other logistics, execution, etc.
- More long-term/repeating of same or similar service projects

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

- Membership dues= \$2 per year (to KSHSAA)
- Conference fees = \$10 per member (RC), \$3 per member (UC)
- Leadership Camp = \$315 (scholarship/funding opportunities)

TOO MANY CLUBS ALREADY?

- Can all students join all clubs? What are the membership requirements?
- KAY is an open membership for all students, a place to belong for every student

LOSS OF SCHOOL TIME?

- Attendance at 1 Regional Conference in fall (8AM-2PM)
- Attendance at 1 Unit Conference in winter (8AM-11:30AM)
- Many service projects can be done at/during/after school

LEADERSHIP TRAINING?

- Attendance at Conferences
- Attendance at summer Leadership Camp
- Participation in club service projects and programs

IDEAS FOR SERVICE PROJECTS?

- KAY Handbook = excellent resource for service projects for school, community, nation, world
- Attendance at KAY Leadership Camp & Conferences provide valuable resource for exchange of ideas/service projects

- Valuable information available on KAY website
- Mentoring program for new sponsors

HOW TO START A KAY PROGRAM

CONSIDERATIONS FOR STARTING A KAY PROGRAM

- 1. School member of Kansas State High School Activities Association.
- 2. Administrator approves of the KAY Club program.
- 3. Students in the school indicate an interest in the club program or the administration see the need and value for the program.
- 4. Administrator appoints a faculty member(s) to plan a meeting and invite the State Director to address interested students.

TO ORGANIZE A KAY CLUB

- 1. Request a sample packet of KAY materials from the KSHSAA. KAY clubs are given 2 Handbooks of materials to assist them one for the president and one for the sponsor(s).
- 2. KAY website provides a lot of information about KAY & it's activities http://www.kshsaa.org/Public/KAY/Main.cfm
- 3. Schedule a meeting for all the students and invite the KAY State Director to visit your school and explain the club program and answer questions.
- 4. Following the meeting, call a short session for all who are interested in organizing such a club. A nominating committee is identified. This committee shall be comprised of 2 representatives from each class and one representative at-large from the entire group. Ask all in attendance to sign the membership list.
- 5. The third meeting is for the purpose of electing officers. It is suggested that the ballots be prepared for the election.
- 6. The officers shall meet with the sponsors to select the board members. NOTE: A list of officers and board member positions is located in the KAY Handbook, Section 1 (Constitution).
- 7. The next meeting should follow the steps identified in GET THE YEAR IN GEAR (located in the KAY HANDBOOK) –Section 2
- 8. The programs and service projects a club will participate in are at the direction of the sponsor, officers and board members with input from the membership.
